




# Name that Wetland!

### Across

1. Predominance of shrubby vegetation along river/stream-side locations.
2. Small in size, but many in number, these pools of water in the woodlands dry up in the summer and fall, but provide important habitat to amphibians in spring.

### Down

3. Blackened masses of fallen deciduous leaves on the forest floor help identify this type, which is the most common and abundant wetland type.
4. These grass-dominated wetlands are the most abundant habitat type bordering the Delaware Estuary and the Atlantic Coast.
5. You might find these small depression wetlands behind the dunes along selected Atlantic coastal beaches.
6. An inland area where broad leafed grasses and flowers are the dominant plant, unlike swamps where trees and shrubs dominate.
7. A community that is dominated by bold cypress trees and is relatively rare, but an ecologically important wetland type.
8. Wet, spongy ground with soil composed mostly of detritus.
