Ms. Calder,


I am writing to object to the proposed Oyster House Village application. Bay Harbor, previously Burtons Farm, was developed in a way to live in tranquility with large lots, enjoying the flora and fauna.

Having owned my home for over 20 years, backing up to the wetlands and canal, I worry how this project will affect wildlife, and the quiet peace of being on the canal.

Furthermore, the conversion of government land to private use for the benefit of a few appears to be counter to the original construction and purpose of the canal which was to be used for the transportation of agricultural products.

Another concern is the staging of dredging operations in what is essentially a tranquil residential neighborhood.
