**DELAWARE PRODUCTIVITY UP 31%; RELEASES DOWN 9% TOXICS RELEASE INVENTORY MARKS 25TH YEAR SHOWING EFFECTIVENESS OF ANTI-POLLUTION EFFORTS** - DNREC's compilation of the annual Toxics Release Inventory (TRI) data and reports for 2011 from Delaware's industrial facilities shows a significant decrease in reported emissions compared to 2010 despite increasing industrial productivity – and a continued trend in reduction in environmental releases and pollution since the first data was collected for 1987. In this 25<sup>th</sup> year of TRI data collection from facilities, the 2011 data continues to reflect the effectiveness of anti-pollution efforts by both industry and government regulatory programs in decreasing emissions. **DE CITY REFINING COMPANY AIR PERMITTING APPLICATION PUBLIC HEARING** –The Division of Air Quality (DAQ) will conduct a public hearing on an air permit application submitted by Delaware City Refining Company (DCRC) to restart the Unit 33 Ether Plant Cooling Tower which has been out of service since 2002, at the Delaware City Refinery. The application states this cooling tower manufactured by GEA Thermal Dynamic Inc. (Model No. TD-3636-3-3040 CXSF) has a design water circulation rate of 30,000 gallons per minute and will result in annual air emissions increases of 5.5 tons of volatile organic compounds and 1.7 tons of particulate matter. **REG. 1102 NATURAL MINOR PERMIT APPLICATIONS** - Notice has been given that Delaware City Refining Company LLC (DCRC), requests a Construction/Operation permit to recommission and restart the Olefins Plant (aka the Olefins Restart Project), which has been out of service since May 2001 at the Delaware City Refinery. As a result of the Olefins Restart Project, a 35 mmBtu/hour existing heater (134-H-101) will be restarted, and 3 product storage tanks (580-TF-10, 582-TF-4 and 583-TF-4) and a feed surge drum (43-D-204) will be returned to service. **SITE INVESTIGATION AND RESTORATION SECTION** – The Division's Site Investigation and Restoration Section (SIRS) is responsible for the identification, evaluation and remediation of sites in Delaware that have had past releases of hazardous substances. The Section manages the contaminated sites under three major programs in accordance with the Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA). The three programs are the Brownfields Development Program, the Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) and the HSCA Enforcement Program (for sites requiring

enforcement action). The Brownfields Development Program encourages the cleanup and redevelopment of vacant, abandoned or underutilized properties, which may be contaminated. A party seeking to develop such a property negotiates with SIRS for a Brownfields Development Agreement (BDA) to perform an investigation and, if necessary, a remedial action or remedy, for the purpose of addressing the risks posed by past releases of hazardous substances at these sites. However, a BDA is only available to parties that are not current site owners. The Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) Agreement is available to site owners, who want to clean up their sites and are already liable as a potentially responsible party for the site. **AGRICULTURAL UTILIZATION PERMIT AMENDMENTS – SYNAGRO CENTRAL, LLC.** - Request for Amendment - State Permit Number AGU 1101-S-03 issued to Synagro Central, LLC.: Synagro Central, LLC. has requested an amendment of their existing agricultural utilization permit, State Permit Number AGU 1101-S-03 to include sludge from the Georgetown Wastewater Treatment Plant. The current permit authorizes Synagro Central, LLC. to land apply biosolids stabilized by Vlastic Foods, Inc. (Division of Pinnacle Foods, Corporation) onto approved farmland owned by Baxter Farms, Inc.
