Residents are encouraged to recycle scrap tires from passenger vehicles and light-duty trucks, with participation helping to reduce environmental and health hazards associated with scrap tires in the state's communities. SITE INVESTIGATION AND RESTORATION – The Division's Site Investigation and Restoration Section (SIRS) is responsible for the identification, evaluation and remediation of sites in Delaware that have had past releases of hazardous substances. The Section manages the contaminated sites under three major programs in accordance with the Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA). The three programs are the Brownfields Development Program, the Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) and the HSCA Enforcement Program (for sites requiring enforcement action). The Brownfields Development Program encourages the cleanup and

redevelopment of vacant, abandoned or underutilized properties, which may be contaminated. A party seeking to develop such a property negotiates with SIRS for a Brownfields Development Agreement (BDA) to perform an investigation and, if necessary, a remedial action or remedy, for the purpose of addressing the risks posed by past releases of hazardous substances at these sites. However, a BDA is only available to parties that are not current site owners. The Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) Agreement is available to site owners, who want to clean up their sites and are already liable as a potentially responsible party for the site. REVISED PROPOSED PLAN OF REMEDIAL ACTION FOR THE 733 S. MARKET STREET SITE (DE-1502) - The Site Investigation and Restoration Section (SIRS) announces the Revised Proposed Plan of Remedial Action (Proposed Plan) for the 733 S. Market Street Site (Site). DNREC issues this Revised Proposed Plan under the authority of the Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA), 7 Del. C. Chapter 91. A Final Plan of Remedial Action was issued for this Site on June 7, 2011. This plan was based on a presumptive remedy that the Site would need remediation to meet restricted (commercial) use criteria. However, results of the brownfield investigation performed on the property showed that environmental impacts to Site soil were not found on the Site in excess of restricted use criteria. Because of these findings, the Proposed Plan is being re-advertised to state that no soil remedy (a cap or one foot of clean fill) is required for commercial use of this property. The following cleanup actions are proposed for the Site:

All construction and redevelopment work, including any soil excavation, will be performed in accordance with a DNREC-approved Contaminated Material and Water Management Work Plan, and the Site Specific Health and Safety Plan (HASP).

A Ground Management Zone (GMZ) is already in place for the City of Wilmington (July 2007). The GMZ will prohibit the installation of any water wells on, or groundwater usage at the Site without prior written approval from DNREC.

Site owner will record an environmental covenant consistent with Delaware's Uniform Environmental Covenants Act, UECA (Title 7, Del. Code Chapter 79, Subtitle II), limiting current and future land use to non-residential uses, prohibit land disturbing activities without DNREC's prior written approval except in landscaping areas, and prohibit the installation of wells and use of any groundwater at the Site.

AMENDED FINAL PLAN OF REMEDIAL ACTION FOR THE DUPONT LOUVIERS- GORE LARGE BORE RANGE SITE (DE-1050) - The Site Investigation and Restoration Section (SIRS) has adopted a plan to clean up the DuPont Louviers- Gore Large Bore Range Site at Papermill Road, Newark. The Site is approximately 200 yards by 100 yards and is part of a larger 157 acre property. The Site is currently covered with vegetation. The Final Plan and Proposed Plan of Remedial Action amends the previously issued 1996 Final Plan of Remedial Action. The 1996 remedial actions cleaned up the site to unrestricted use cleanup for lead. As a result, the environmental covenant required in the 1996 Proposed and Final Plan of Remedial Action is no longer required. No other remedial actions are required at this site for lead. FINAL PLAN OF REMEDIAL ACTION FOR THE CHRYSLER NEWARK ASSEMBLY PLANT SITE (OU-6) (DE-0105) - The Site Investigation and Restoration Section (SIRS) has adopted a plan regarding the clean-up of Operable Unit 6 of the Chrysler Newark Assembly Plant Site located in Newark. The Site is owned by 1743 Holdings, LLC, a wholly-owned subsidiary of the University of Delaware. The Site is being redeveloped as the future location of the University of Delaware's Science and Technology Campus. The Final Plan for OU-6 requires: 1. Design and installation of a vapor barrier entirely beneath any enclosed, continuously-occupied structures constructed on OU-6 within a 100 foot radius of MW-4, 2. Recording of an environmental covenant on the property deed. The covenant will: a) prohibit the installation of groundwater wells for drinking water purposes without the prior written approval of DNREC and b) identify the Site as located within a Groundwater Management Zone, 3. Development and implementation of a DNREC-approved Long-Term Stewardship (LTS) Plan. The LTS Plan will detail the groundwater monitoring network and schedule to be followed in order to monitor the attenuation of the groundwater COCs and 4. Development and implementation of a Contaminated Materials Management Plan (CMMP) to ensure that contaminated materials encountered during intrusive activities are handled properly.
