NEWS UPDATES:

AIR QUALITY IMPROVEMENTS UNVEILED AT TRINITY PORT SERVICES IN NEW CASTLE -

A cooperative project that improves Delaware air quality and the quality of life for neighborhood residents was unveiled today at a ceremony at Trinity Port Services in New Castle. Twenty electrified outlets that power refrigerated storage containers at the company's Rogers Road site have replaced the use of diesel generators, significantly reducing air pollutants, diesel fumes and noise in the community. The project addresses the problems of air pollution, odors and noise that have affected residents who live near the facility. Neighbors and community leaders from local civic associations were instrumental in bringing the problems to the attention of environmental advocacy organizations and the state government. After Trinity Port Services acquired the business in 2007, company management immediately recognized the needs of the neighborhood, moved equipment and installed barriers to reduce noise and diesel fumes in the area. Additionally, the company has implemented environmentally-friendly improvements at the site. SECRETARY'S ORDER:

PIGEON POINT LANDFILL, DSWA REQUEST FOR MAJOR MODIFICATION TO SOLID

WASTE POST CLOSURE PERMIT SW -08/01 - On April 13, 2012 the Secretary of the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) issued Secretary's Order

No. 2012-A-0010 in response to the Delaware Solid Waste Authority's (DSWA) request for a major modification of the post-closure permit (SW-08/01) for the closed Pigeon Point Landfill. The Order requires the issuance of a modified permit that will continue to regulate post-closure care activities at this closed landfill located at 1101 Lambsons Lane, New Castle. Also known as the Northern Solid Waste Management Center-1, the landfill was closed by DSWA in October 1985 and has remained closed since that time. The original post-closure permit SW-08/01 was issued to the DSWA and the City of Wilmington (co-permittees) on November 19, 2008. The modified permit will continue to regulate the post-closure care activities of the co-permittees at the site in accordance with the requirements of the Delaware Regulations Governing Solid Waste. FORMER STRAIGHT LINE FILTERS SITE (DE-1488) - The Site Investigation and Restoration Section (SIRS) invites public comment on a proposal to address the Former

Straight Line Filters site located in Wilmington. The Site is currently owned by 701 Port, LLC. and is approximately 1.91 acres in size. Based on the results of multiple environmental investigations, remove extra space contaminants of concern have been identified in soil and groundwater from past site activities. The Proposed Plan for the Site requires: 1. Capping the Site with at least one foot of clean fill or impervious material such as buildings, asphalt, or concrete. 2. Recording of an Environmental Covenant on the property deed. 3. Developing and implementing a DNREC-approved Long Term Stewardship (LTS) Plan to ensure that the enacted protective measures are properly maintained including maintenance of the cap and landscaped areas. FORMER PEP-UP SITE OU-1 (DE-1491) - The Site Investigation and Restoration Section (SIRS) invites public comment on a proposal to clean up the Former Pep-Up Site located at 310 North Race Street in Georgetown. The 1-acre Site consists of an office/warehouse building with a gravel parking lot in a mixed residential/commercial area. The site soil is contaminated with benzene, 2-methylnaphthalene and naphthalene related to the Site's former use as a fuel storage and distribution center for Pep-Up. An interim action of soil removal and addition of oxidation chemicals to the Site has removed most of the benzene contamination. The proposed cleanup includes restricting the Site to commercial use, restrict soil disturbance, and developing a plan to safely handle soil with the goal of making the Site suitable for commercial use. GROUND WATER DISCHARGES PERMITS – The following have filed an application:

SPRAY IRRIGATION PERMIT

The Town of Georgetown has applied to the Ground Water Discharges Section for a Construction Permit to expand the Town of Georgetown Wastewater Reclamation Facility to include 88.8 acres of the Pettyjohn Woods Site (Sussex County Tax Map Parcel Number 135-24.00-1.00) for receiving spray irrigated treated wastewater. The Pettyjohn Woods Site is located east of Cedar Lane (Rd 318), adjacent to and immediately north of the wastewater treatment plant, between Elis Walls ditch and Peterkins Branch. The construction permit would authorize the installation of above-ground piping and appurtenances from the treatment facility to distribute treated effluent from the Town of Georgetown Wastewater Reclamation Facility onto to the Pettyjohn Woods Site. The Town of Georgetown Wastewater Reclamation Facility treats and spray irrigates domestic wastewater collected from the Town of Georgetown. The facility is located on County Road 318, south of the Eli Walls Ditch and north of Gills Branch. The treated domestic wastewater is currently applied to spray fields located on County Road 318, south of Eli Walls Ditch and between County Road 318, 432 and 48 and Gills Branch.

Sussex County Council has applied to the Ground Water Discharges Section for a renewal of Spray Irrigation Permit LTS 5005-95-05; DEN 359338-01. The permit authorizes the operation and maintenance of the facility known as Wolfe Neck Regional Wastewater Facility. The Wolfe Neck Regional Wastewater Facility treats and spray irrigates domestic wastewater from the West Rehoboth expansion of the Dewey Beach

Sanitary Sewer District. The facility and spray fields are located on the east end of County Road 270, approximately 1.2 miles east of Route 1. A public hearing on the above applications will NOT be held unless the Secretary of DNREC receives a request for a hearing by June 5, 2012. UNDERGROUND INJECTION CONTROL PERMIT

The DuPont Company [DuPont Stine Haskell Research Center], located at 1090 Elkton Road, Newark has applied to the Ground Water Discharges Section for an amendment to their current Underground Injection Control (UIC) permit, to include the construction and operation of four (4) additional injection points (steam traps in the form of dry wells) for discharging infiltrated rainwater and steam condensate from various process boilers at the facility. The Company is also renewing their UIC Permit for another five (5) years.

SITE INVESTIGATION AND RESTORATION – The Division's Site Investigation and Restoration Section (SIRS) is responsible for the identification, evaluation and remediation of sites in Delaware that have had past releases of hazardous substances. The Section manages the contaminated sites under three major programs in accordance with the Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA). The three programs are the Brownfields Development Program, the Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) and the HSCA Enforcement Program (for sites requiring enforcement action). The Brownfields Development Program encourages the cleanup and redevelopment of vacant, abandoned or underutilized properties, which may be contaminated. A party seeking to develop such a property negotiates with SIRS for a Brownfields Development Agreement (BDA) to perform an investigation and, if necessary, a remedial action or remedy, for the purpose of addressing the risks posed by past releases of hazardous substances at these sites. However, a BDA is only available to parties that are not current site owners. The Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) Agreement is available to site owners, who want to clean up their sites and are already liable as a potentially responsible party for the site. Proposed Revisions to 1375 Regulations Governing Hazardous Substance Cleanup – The Site Investigation and Restoration Section (SIRS) will hold a public hearing at 6:00 p.m. on Thursday, May 31, 2012 regarding proposed changes to the Regulations Governing Hazardous Substance Cleanup. The hearing will be held in DNREC's Auditorium, Richardson & Robbins Building, 89 Kings Highway, Dover, 19901. The Regulations Governing Hazardous Substance Cleanup have undergone revisions one time since their adoption in 1996 to establish criteria for designating a Brownfield property in 2002. The regulation revisions being proposed at this time are meant to clarify and update the processes the SIRS uses when performing investigations and remedies of releases of hazardous substances. In addition, the revisions create regulations for notification requirements, as well as certifying and decertifying consultants as provided for in 7 Del.C. §9104 (2) (r). The hearing record on the proposed changes to the Regulations Governing Hazardous Substance Cleanup will open May 1, 2012.
