UNIVERSAL RECYCLING AVAILABLE JANUARY 1, 2013 FOR DELAWARE'S MULTI-FAMILY COMPLEXES

New Year's Day 2013 marks the expansion of recycling services in Delaware to include multi-family apartment and condominium complexes. Waste collectors have partnered with multi-family complexes to provide recycling services along with their trash services through the state's universal recycling program. All single family homes that have trash collection service began receiving recycling service from their waste haulers in September 2011, as did most restaurants and bars. By Jan. 1, 2014, all commercial businesses will be participating in a comprehensive recycling program. Recycling participation is dramatically higher throughout Delaware in the last 15 months, according to reports from waste haulers, while landfill disposal volumes are down. Multi-family dwellings – apartment and condo complexes – will be provided recycling collection in the same fashion as their trash collection. Single stream recycling, which allows all recyclables to be tossed together into one container for pickup, separate from the trash, has made recycling easier than ever before. CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING – A DELAWARE POST-HOLIDAY TRADITION – CARRIES ON STATEWIDE FOR 2012-13- TAKE YOUR TREE TO A YARD WASTE SITE OR CONTACT YOUR WASTE COLLECTOR

Delawareans are encouraged to give their recycling spirit a boost after the holiday season by delivering their Christmas trees to one of many yard waste recycling facilities located throughout the state. Many of the facilities will accept the trees for free; they are listed below. **(Please note that Christmas trees are no longer accepted for recycling at any Delaware State Park locations.)** Christmas trees will be accepted for recycling from December 26 to Jan. 26, 2013 from families only at the facilities listed below. Trees will not be accepted from commercial haulers or tree vendors without prior approval. Artificial decorations, including hooks, wire, tinsel and ornaments, as well as wood and metal tree stands, must be removed from all trees before dropping them off for recycling. Christmas tree recycling saves valuable landfill space. At least 18 percent of residential waste is composed of grass, leaves, brush, trees and other lawn maintenance and landscaped materials. Many entities collect Christmas trees, including various waste haulers and landscapers. Your regular trash hauler may provide one-time collection for Christmas trees in January. HOLIDAY TIME IS THE RIGHT TIME TO RECYCLE IN DELAWARE - DNREC reminds Delawareans that holiday time is the right time to trim your “wasteline” while helping the environment – by recycling all those extra mail order boxes, gift-wrapped packages, tags and cards. It’s easier than ever to recycle these holiday items and other discards through Delaware’s Universal Recycling program and keep them out of the state’s landfills. The new streamlined form of recycling in Delaware’s Universal Recycling program – single stream – makes holiday season recycling easier because no sorting is needed: Simply toss all your recyclables into your recycling container for curbside pickup. Here are some helpful tips for recycling this season as well as for reducing and reusing materials for the holidays next year:

Recycle unwanted boxes, wrapping paper (without foil backing), card stock type gift tags, cards and envelopes along with all the holiday catalogues and promotional mail. Tissue paper cannot be recycled.

Collect and reuse boxes, ribbons, bows and other gift decorations for next year.

Save used Christmas cards to cut up as gift tags for next year.

Use dishes, silverware and cloth napkins instead of disposable utensils, Styrofoam and paper products.

REQUEST FOR MODIFICATIONS TO HAZARDOUS WASTE STORAGE PERMIT – The Solid and Hazardous Waste Management Section (SHWMS) has received a request from DuPont to modify the hazardous waste storage permit (HW04A22) issued to the DuPont Experimental Station located at the intersection of Route 141 and Henry Clay Road in Wilmington. These permit modifications are requested to:

Allow the Experimental Station hazardous waste storage facility to continue to manage hazardous waste, currently generated at the Experimental Station by the DuPont Performance Coatings (DPC) business, after ownership of DPC is transferred to its successor.

Incorporate container storage of the Experimental Station Thermal Waste Treatment process residues (ash and dust) into the permit. Currently, the process residues are managed as "in-process materials" not included in the scope of the permit. The existing in-process storage areas will be re-designated as permitted storage areas D, E, and F. The existing storage area prior to shipment off-site will be re-designated as Pad G. The requested modifications do not change the type or amount of waste currently being managed at the Experimental Station. As such, the requested modifications are categorized as Class 2 modifications in accordance with Delaware's Regulations Governing Hazardous Waste (DRGHW), Section 122.42(b).

SITE INVESTIGATION AND RESTORATION SECTION – The Division's Site Investigation and Restoration Section (SIRS) is responsible for the identification, evaluation and remediation of sites in Delaware that have had past releases of hazardous substances. The Section manages the contaminated sites under three major programs in accordance with the Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA). The three programs are the Brownfields Development Program, the Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) and the HSCA Enforcement Program (for sites requiring enforcement action). The Brownfields Development Program encourages the cleanup and redevelopment of vacant, abandoned or underutilized properties, which may be contaminated. A party seeking to develop such a property negotiates with SIRS for a Brownfields Development Agreement (BDA) to perform an investigation and, if necessary, a remedial action or remedy, for the purpose of addressing the risks posed by past releases of hazardous substances at these sites. However, a BDA is only available to parties that are not current site owners. The Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) Agreement is available to site owners, who want to clean up their sites and are already liable as a potentially responsible party for the site.
