NEWS UPDATES

CITY OF NEWARK KICKS OFF ANTI-IDLING CAMPAIGN - Federal, state, city and school officials gathered at Newark High School to kick off a citywide anti-idling awareness campaign for cleaner air, better health and savings at the gas pump. Newark Mayor Vance Funk was joined by DNREC Secretary Collin O'Mara, U.S. EPA Region III Administrator Shawn M. Garvin, Christina School District Superintendent Dr. Freeman Williams, Deborah Brown, president and CEO of the American Lung Association of the Mid-Atlantic, and other officials to announce the campaign, which was created to promote awareness of Newark's anti-idling ordinance. Passed in 2009, the ordinance restricts idling of personal motor vehicles within city limits. To kick off the campaign, the City of Newark introduced its new "Stop Idling – It's the Law" signage, with 11 signs newly posted where students are dropped off and picked up at the high school. More than 300 of the signs will be placed in strategic locations throughout the city to remind drivers not to leave their engines running while parked. Warming up a vehicle is the most common reason given for idling. Many drivers also have become accustomed to idling cars in the morning, at the ATM, at the drive-thru for lunch, when picking up children from school, while using a cell phone, or while waiting to pump gas. Research indicates that the average driver idles their car for 10 minutes a day, using about 0.026 gallons of gasoline at a cost of 5 cents, and producing about 9.5 ounces of carbon dioxide, or approximately 1,252 pounds per driver per year. Two minutes of idling uses the same amount of gas as 1 mile of driving. Idling releases toxic emissions into the air, including nitrogen oxides, volatile organic compounds, particulates, carbon monoxide and carbon dioxide. Just one car idling while dropping off and picking up a child at school each day harms air quality by adding about 3 pounds of pollution to the air each month. One driver can also improve air quality by changing their idling habit. By consistently turning off the engine when parked and restarting it when ready to move, a driver can reduce air pollution by four to five pounds per month – and save money on gasoline at the same time. INTENT TO REVOKE WASTE TRANSPORTER PERMIT – The Solid and Hazardous Waste Management Section (SHWMS) is providing notice of its intent to revoke the hazardous waste transporter permit issued to Horwith Trucks, Inc. located in Northampton, Pennsylvania. The decision to revoke the permit is based on information submitted by Horwith Trucks, Inc. indicating that it has incurred no less than 14 violations of failing to contain regulated waste, including hazardous waste, within the transport vehicle in the last five (5) years. While the violations were not incurred in Delaware, the SHWMS has concerns about Horwith Truck's ability to comply with its Delaware permit and prevent releases in the state. This is particularly true, as the company has incurred increasing monetary penalties following each incidence of release, yet has not successfully implemented an effective program to ensure waste is contained in the vehicle, as the three (3) most recent violations occurred in September, October, and November of this year. Revocation of the permit shall become effective 30 days from the date of the publication of this Notice, unless a written request for a public hearing is received by DNREC on or before February 22, 2013. If DNREC does not receive a timely written request for a public hearing, the revocation will become final without further action. DELAWARE SOLID WASTE AUTHORITY (DSWA) CHERRY ISLAND LANDFILL PERMIT MODIFICATION - Notice is hereby given, pursuant to 7 Del. C Section 6004 that the Solid and Hazardous Management Section (SHWMS) intends to modify the existing solid waste facility permit for the Delaware Solid Waste Authority's (DSWA) Cherry Island Landfill (CIL) Located at 1706 E. 12th Street Wilmington. This modification was first initiated by the CIL Citizens Advisory Board (CAB) whose members, on December 16, 2010, requested a permit amendment to reduce CAB meetings from quarterly to three times per year. This was followed by a December 9, 2011 request from DSWA for a minor modification to revise their geotechnical monitoring plan for the CIL. SHWMS has also chosen to include other minor and administrative revisions of the permit as part of this modification process including an updated landfill gas migration monitoring plan, an

updated environmental monitoring plan, and changes to reporting procedures that will include more explicit permit conditions for electronic reporting of environmental monitoring data. SHWMS is also proposing changes to the permit to include new requirements for inspecting/reporting leachate seeps, and new requirements for managing stormwater. SHWMS also plans to relax the permit condition that currently requires CAB members live within 5 miles of the CIL. The permit modifications do not extend the expiration date of the landfill permit or increase the size of the landfill. A public hearing on the above permit modification will not be held unless the Secretary of DNREC, in care of Robert Hartman, receives a meritorious request for a hearing by close of business on February 27, 2013.

SITE INVESTIGATION AND RESTORATION SECTION – The Division’s Site Investigation and Restoration Section (SIRS) is responsible for the identification, evaluation and remediation of sites in Delaware that have had past releases of hazardous substances. The Section manages the contaminated sites under three major programs in accordance with the Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA). The three programs are the Brownfields Development Program, the Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) and the HSCA Enforcement Program (for sites requiring enforcement action). The Brownfields Development Program encourages the cleanup and redevelopment of vacant, abandoned or underutilized properties, which may be contaminated. A party seeking to develop such a property negotiates with SIRS for a Brownfields Development Agreement (BDA) to perform an investigation and, if necessary, a remedial action or remedy, for the purpose of addressing the risks posed by past releases of hazardous substances at these sites. However, a BDA is only available to parties that are not current site owners. The Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) Agreement is available to site owners, who want to clean up their sites and are already liable as a potentially responsible party for the site.
