LEGAL NOTICE - PUBLIC HEARINGS

The Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) will conduct four public hearings on proposed revisions to Delaware air regulations and Delaware’s State Implementation Plan (SIP). The hearings will address:

- Repeal of 7 DE Admin. Code 1123 regarding Standards of Performance for Steel Plants: Electric Arc Furnaces.
- Amendment to 7 DE Admin. Code 1136 to update of the federal reference date in regards to the Acid Rain Program.
- Amendments to 7 DE Admin. Code 1140 to update the adoption by reference of California’s Low Emission Vehicle (LEV) III and the Greenhouse Gas (GHG) standards.

- SIP revisions: 1) certification that the Delaware Emission Statement program and the Preconstruction Review program meet all 2008 Ozone NAAQS requirements, and 2) a negative declaration that the state of Delaware has no sources covered by EPA's 2016 Oil and Gas Control Techniques Guidelines.

The hearings will be held on Wednesday, **October 25**, beginning at 6:00 PM at the DNREC Auditorium, located at the Richardson & Robbins Building, 89 Kings Highway, Dover, DE. The four separate hearings will be held in succession, in the order shown above, beginning at 6:00PM. Persons interested in one or more of the hearings should arrive by 6:00PM, as these changes are expected to be non-controversial and the hearings may progress quickly. The proposed revisions are available for public review at the Department's offices at 715 Grantham Lane, New Castle, DE and 100 West Water Street, Suite 6A, Dover, DE. LEGAL NOTICE - TITLE V SYNTHETIC MINOR PERMIT APPLICATIONS

Notice is hereby given that Orient Corporation of America, LLC has requested a permit amendment pursuant to a meeting held with representatives of the Division of Air Quality on June 14, 2017 and 7 DE Admin. Code 1102 for the facility located at 111 Park Avenue, Seaford, Delaware 19973. As part of this amendment, the Orient Corporation of America's permitted limit for Volatile Organic Compound (VOC) and Hazardous Air Pollutant (HAP) emissions will be reduced by 1.59 pounds per hour and 7.05 tons per year (TPY) and Nitrogen Oxides (NOX) emissions will be reduced by 4.25 pounds per hour and 18.71 TPY. Additionally, an emission limitation for Carbon Monoxide (CO) will be introduced at a rate of 0.51 pounds per hour and 2.23 TPY. These limits are necessary to restrict Orient Corporation of America's potential to emit air pollutants, and the limit will be enforceable by the EPA and the state. LEGAL NOTICE - NOTIFICATION OF NEGOTIATIONS CONCERNING A VOLUNTARY AGREEMENT FOR THE TRUITT DUMP SITE (DE-0178)

Pursuant to the June 2000 amendment to the Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA), 7 Del. C. § 9107 (a)(1), the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) is required to issue a public notice announcing the onset of negotiations concerning Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) Agreements, as well as any voluntary settlement agreements requiring a remedy, between DNREC and potentially responsible parties. The amendment states that DNREC must provide "public notification within 20 days after entering into negotiations for a voluntary cleanup settlement agreement with any person that agrees to perform a remedy." The Site Investigation and Restoration Section (SIRS), on behalf of DNREC, initiated the VCP in February 1995 in an effort to lessen the time and cost required in cleaning up contaminated sites by reducing litigation. VCP Agreements are available, upon application to DNREC, to potentially responsible parties or prospective purchasers who may be liable for the contamination of a property, but who wish to settle their liabilities with DNREC under HSCA. DNREC is negotiating a VCP Agreement with Michael Uhlfelder regarding the Truitt Dump Site (Site) located at 9415 Cherry Lane in Seaford, Delaware. The approximate 5.86 acre Site is identified on the maps of Sussex County as tax parcel number 1-32 7.00 31.10. The Site may have had a release of hazardous substances as a result of past use as a landfill. The Brownfields Development Program encourages the cleanup and redevelopment of vacant, abandoned, or underutilized properties, which may be contaminated. A party seeking to develop such a property negotiates with SIRS for a **Brownfields Development Agreement (BDA)** to perform an investigation and, if necessary, a remedial action or remedy, for the purpose of addressing the risks posed by past releases of hazardous substances at these sites. However, a BDA is only available to parties that are not current site owners. The **Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) Agreement** is available to site owners who want to clean up their sites and are already liable as a potentially responsible party for the site.
