DIVISION OF WASTE AND HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES

SITE INVESTIGATION AND RESTORATION SECTION (SIRS) is responsible for the identification, evaluation, and remediation of sites in Delaware that have had past releases of hazardous substances. The section manages the contaminated sites under three major programs in accordance with the Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA). The three programs are the **Brownfields Development Program**, the **Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP)**, and the **HSCA Enforcement Program** (for sites requiring enforcement action).

The Brownfields Development Program encourages the cleanup and redevelopment of either the entire property, the expansion of the property, or the reuse of the property which may be hindered by the reasonable held belief that the property may be contaminated. A party seeking to develop such a property negotiates with SIRS for a **Brownfields Development Agreement (BDA)** to perform an investigation and, if necessary, a remedy, for the purpose of addressing the risks posed by past releases of hazardous substances at these sites. However, a BDA is only available to parties that are not current owners or operators of the site. The **Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) Agreement** is available to site owners who want to clean up their sites and are already liable as a potentially responsible party for the site.

LEGAL NOTICE - NOTIFICATION OF NEGOTIATIONS CONCERNING A VOLUNTARY AGREEMENT FOR THE 1620/1630 BOWERS STREET SITE (DE-1441)

Pursuant to the June 2000 amendment to the Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA), 7 Del.

C. § 9107 (a)(1), the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) is required to issue a public notice announcing the onset of negotiations concerning Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) Agreements, as well as any voluntary settlement agreements requiring a remedy, between DNREC and potentially responsible parties.

The amendment states that DNREC must provide “public notification within 20 days after entering into negotiations for a voluntary cleanup settlement agreement with any person that agrees to perform a remedy.”

The Site Investigation and Restoration Section (SIRS), on behalf of DNREC, initiated the VCP in February 1995 in an effort to lessen the time and cost required in cleaning up contaminated sites by reducing litigation. VCP Agreements are available, upon application to DNREC, to potentially responsible parties or prospective purchasers who may be liable for the contamination of a property, but who wish to settle their liabilities with DNREC under HSCA.

DNREC is negotiating a VCP Agreement with Pure Green Industries, Inc. regarding the 1620/1630 Bowers Street Site, located at 1620/1630 Bowers Street in Wilmington, Delaware. The approximate 1.9 acre Site is identified on the maps of New Castle County as tax parcel number 26-037.00-010. The Site may have had a release of hazardous substances as a result of the historic activities on site.
