LEGAL NOTICE - PUBLIC HEARING

The Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) Division of Air Quality will conduct a public hearing on proposed amendments to 7 DE Admin. Code 1150, Outer Continental Shelf Air Regulations.

7 DE Admin. Code 1150 was promulgated in June 2010 to allow Delaware to regulate air emissions pursuant to the United States Environmental Protection Agency's regulations codified at 40 CFR Part 55, which were issued under Section 328(a)(1) of the federal Clean Air Act. The EPA's regulations apply to all sources of air emissions from within the Outer Continental Shelf (OCS). For Delaware, the OCS is the area that is within 25 miles of Delaware's coastal boundaries along the Atlantic Ocean. This means that air emissions from within the OCS are regulated in the same manner as if the source was located on Delaware's land. In practice, this regulation allows the Department to issue permits for any source to be regulated under 40 CFR Part 55, thereby effectively regulating air pollutants emitted in the OCS consistent with state and federal laws and regulations.

The Division of Air Quality (DAQ) is proposing to amend 7 DE Admin. Code 1150 to incorporate updates to the OCS regulations at 40 CFR Part 55, which have been finalized since the state regulation was adopted in 2010.

SITE INVESTIGATION AND RESTORATION SECTION (SIRS) is responsible for the identification, evaluation, and remediation of sites in Delaware that have had past releases of hazardous substances. The section manages the contaminated sites under three major programs in accordance with the Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA). The three programs are the **Brownfields Development Program, the Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP), and the HSCA Enforcement Program** (for sites requiring enforcement action).

The Brownfields Development Program encourages the cleanup and redevelopment of either the entire property, the expansion of the property, or the reuse of the property which may be hindered by the reasonable held belief that the property may be contaminated. A party seeking to develop such a property negotiates with SIRS for a **Brownfields Development Agreement (BDA)** to perform an investigation and, if necessary, a remedy, for the purpose of addressing the risks posed by past releases of hazardous substances at these sites. However, a BDA is only available to parties that are not current owners or operators of the site. **The Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) Agreement** is available to site owners who want to clean up their sites and are already liable as a potentially responsible party for the site.

LEGAL NOTICE - AMENDED FINAL PLAN OF REMEDIAL ACTION FOR THE Oyster House Village Site (DE-1573)

The Department has adopted a plan regarding the clean-up of the Oyster House Village Site located in Rehoboth, DE. The remedy consists of: 1) Placement of a cap in the South Area, 2) Submittal of a Remedial Action Work Plan (RAWP) for the North Area to remove buried organic debris and relocation onsite or disposal off-site of any surface organic debris, 3) placement of an environmental covenant limiting land disturbing activities, limiting groundwater withdrawal, compliance with a contaminated material management plan (CMMP) and Long-Term Stewardship (LTS) Plan, 4) preparation of a CMMP for new construction or soil disturbing activities, 5) Development of a DNREC approved Long-Term Stewardship (LTS) Plan to monitor the cap.

LEGAL NOTICE - FINAL PLAN OF REMEDIAL ACTION FOR THE CitiSteel (Former EVRAZ-Claymont Steel) Operable Unit #2 (DE-0046)

The Department has adopted a plan regarding the clean-up of Operable Unit 2 of the CitiSteel (Former EVRAZ-Claymont Steel) Site located at 4001 Philadelphia Pike in Claymont, Delaware. The 165-acre Operable Unit is primarily undeveloped, but was utilized as a former landfill for electric arc furnace dust, for disposal of sediment from dredging of the former cooling water pond drainage swale/old Naamans Creek, and for disposal of slag from former production processes. Site soils need to be kept from the adjacent Naamans Creek, the Delaware River and the small onsite pond during redevelopment activities to protect identified Key Wildlife Habitat. Further, the former cooling pond drainage swale will be closed/filled, select "hotspots" of contaminated soil will be excavated and transported to a permitted disposal facility, petroleum sheen in two site monitoring wells will be addressed, and the former electric arc furnace dust landfill located onsite will be protected from disturbance. Additionally, future uses of the site will be restricted to non-residential uses, groundwater use will be restricted at the site, and no land disturbing activities will take place without prior written approval from DNREC.
