WHS - SITE INVESTIGATION AND RESTORATION SECTION (SIRS) is responsible for the identification, evaluation and remediation of sites in Delaware that have had past releases of hazardous substances. The section manages the contaminated sites under three major programs in accordance with the Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA). The three programs are the **Brownfields Development Program, the Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) and the HSCA Enforcement Program** (for sites requiring enforcement action).

The Brownfields Development Program encourages the cleanup and redevelopment of vacant, abandoned or underutilized properties, which may be contaminated. A party seeking to develop such a property negotiates with SIRS for a **Brownfields Development Agreement (BDA)** to perform an investigation and, if necessary, a remedial action or remedy, for the purpose of addressing the risks posed by past releases of hazardous substances at these sites. However, a BDA is only available to parties that are not current site owners. The **Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) Agreement** is available to site owners who want to clean up their sites and are already liable as a potentially responsible party for the site.

Agricultural Utilization Permit

Clean Delaware, LLC has requested renewal of their existing agricultural utilization (AGU) permit, State Permit Number AGU 1202-S-03. Distribution and Marketing Permit – Request for Renewal

The City of Seaford currently has a permit for the distribution and marketing of a Class A Exceptional Quality (EQ) compost product. The facility is located on the south side of the Seaford, adjacent to the Nanticoke River. The City of Seaford composting operation consists of the blending of organic waste products (Biosolids) from the Seaford Wastewater Treatment Facility with bulking materials consisting of wood chips, tire chips, and other similar bulking materials. The composting operation (stabilization) employs the aerated static pile method in which the compost matrix must achieve regulated time, temperature, and oxygen requirements. Finished compost is sampled for bacterial, chemical and nutrient content to assure compliance with state and federal regulatory requirements as a Class A EQ biosolid product. Finished compost may be distributed under the D&M permit to individuals or commercial entities for use in agricultural and horticultural applications as a soil amendment. The City of Seaford requests that their existing permit for the production of composted biosolids product be renewed under the Department's

Guidance and Regulations Governing the Land Treatment of Wastes, Part III, B., Regulations Governing the Land Treatment of Sludges and Sludge Products which allows for such activity pending public notice. General Concentrated Animal Feeding Operation Permits

The Surface Water Discharges Section and the Department of Agriculture, Nutrient Management Program, hereby give notice that the following farms have applied for coverage under National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) General Concentrated Animal Feeding Operation (CAFO) Permit Number DE 5000N/11, to operate a Large, Medium, or Designated Poultry CAFO without land application of manure under Section 9.5 of the DNREC's Regulations Governing the Control of Water Pollution. Large CAFO's are characterized as having equal to or greater than 125,000 chickens (C), 82,000 laying hens (L), or 55,000 turkeys (T). Medium CAFO's are characterized as having 37,500-124,999 chickens, 25,000-81,999 laying hens, or 16,500-54,999 turkeys. Designated CAFO's are determined by the department and can be any size. Chicken manure is not land applied by these farms and is exported off the farm. Manure is stored and mortalities are handled in a manner to prevent contamination of waters of the state. All farms have Animal Waste Management Plans that meet the criteria of the CAFO Regulations. Manure, litter, and/or process wastewater discharges are prohibited from the production area. There are currently no known existing production area discharge points at these farms. Any discharges of manure, litter, and/or process wastewater that may occur would be new discharges and are required to be reported to the departments.
