LEGAL NOTICE - Notice of Public Hearing Date Change

The DNREC-TMS will conduct the public hearing on the proposed amendments to Delaware Administrative Code 1353: Boiler Safety Regulations for Boilers, Pressure Vessels, and Nuclear Installations on **Thursday, February 28**, instead of January 25, 2018. This change is due to the recent severe weather which prevented a legal notice from appearing in two newspapers with statewide circulation 20 days prior to the scheduled public hearing. These amendments are being proposed to reduce the likelihood of an incident that could cause harm to life or property from a regulated boiler system or pressure vessel. The public hearing on the proposed amendments to the Boiler Safety Regulations will now be held on February 28, 2018, beginning at 6:00 PM at the DNREC Richardson and Robbins (R&R) Building Auditorium at 89 Kings Highway, Dover, DE 19901.

Federally Enforceable 7 DE Admin. Code 1102 Applications

Notice is hereby given that the DuPont Experimental Station having a facility at 200 Powder Mill Road in Wilmington, Delaware, has requested a federally enforceable 7 DE Admin. While combusting No. 2 fuel oil, to be used only as an emergency back-up fuel source, the boiler will be permitted to emit up to 10.0 pounds per hour of NOX, 7.4 pounds per hour of CO, 3.0 pounds per hour of PM10, 0.15 pounds per hour of SOX, and 0.40 pounds per hour of VOCs.

Upon completion of construction, the Department will incorporate the operating conditions and limits of the 7 DE Admin. Code 1102 Construction permit into the facility's Title V permit (Permit: AQM-003/00011) via the ongoing Title V renewal process.
