Federally Enforceable 7 DE Admin Code 1102 Applications

Notice is hereby given that the DuPont Experimental Station having a facility at 200 Powder Mill Road in Wilmington, Delaware, has requested a federally enforceable 7 DE Admin. Code 1102 construction permit (Permit: APC-2017/0147-CONSTRUCTION (NSPS)(FE)) for the construction of Boiler 7 which is replacing Boiler 4 and will be equipped with both low NOX burner (LNB) and flue gas recirculation (FGR) technology. Boiler 7 has the potential, and will be permitted, to emit up to 3.6 pounds per hour and 15.7 tons per year (TPY) of nitrogen oxides (NOX), 7.4 pounds per hour and 32.4 TPY of carbon monoxide (CO), 0.50 pounds per hour and 2.188 TPY of particulate matter less than 10 microns (PM10), 0.059 pounds per hour and 0.26 TPY of sulfur oxides (SOX), and 0.40 pounds per hour and 1.75 TPY of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) while combusting natural gas. While combusting No. 2 fuel oil, to be used only as an emergency back-up fuel source, the boiler will be permitted to emit up to 10.0 pounds per hour of NOX, 7.4 pounds per hour of CO, 3.0 pounds per hour of PM10, 0.15 pounds per hour of SOX, and 0.40 pounds per hour of VOCs.

Upon completion of construction, the Department will incorporate the operating conditions and limits of the 7 DE Admin. Code 1102 Construction permit into the facility’s Title V permit (Permit: AQM-003/00011) via the ongoing Title V renewal process.

SOLID AND HAZARDOUS WASTE MANAGEMENT SECTION - The Solid and Hazardous Waste Management Section (SHWMS) hereby gives notice that a permit application has been received from the

following companies to transport regulated RCRA hazardous and/or non-hazardous solid wastes in, out of, or through the State of Delaware. The three programs are the **Brownfields Development Program, the Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP), and the HSCA Enforcement Program** (for sites requiring enforcement action).

The Brownfields Development Program encourages the cleanup and redevelopment of either the entire property, the expansion of the property, or the reuse of the property which may be hindered by the reasonable held belief that the property may be contaminated. A party seeking to develop such a property negotiates with SIRS for a **Brownfields Development Agreement (BDA)** to perform an investigation and, if necessary, a remedy, for the purpose of addressing the risks posed by past releases of hazardous substances at these sites. However, a BDA is only available to parties that are not current owners or operators of the site. The **Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) Agreement** is available to site owners who want to clean up their sites and are already liable as a potentially responsible party for the site.

Storm water in contact with the food processing area as well as non-process wastewater are received by storm water catch basins and directed to a wet pond. The wet pond utilizes the pollutant removal mechanisms of settling, vegetative uptake, adsorption, filtration, decomposition as well as dissipation to reduce nitrogen, phosphorus, total suspended solids (TSS) and biochemical oxygen demand (BOD) loads prior to discharging to a catchment box; which discharges to Providence Creek.
