PUBLIC HEARING ON PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO DELAWARE AIR REGULATION 7 DE ADMIN CODE 1101 “DEFINITIONS AND ADMINISTRATIVE PRINCIPLES”

This action is to revise the definition of volatile organic compounds (VOC) in Section 2.0 “Definitions” of 7 DE Admin Code 1101 so that it comports with federal requirements specified at 40 CFR 51.100. In summary, the action adds eight compounds to the list of compounds exempted from regulation as a VOC, and eliminates recordkeeping, reporting and modeling requirements associated with the already exempt compound t-butyl acetate (TBAC). This action is not anticipated to negatively impact air quality, and reduces the regulatory requirements that apply to existing and new businesses to allow the use and sale of products the regulation currently prohibits. WHS - SITE INVESTIGATION AND RESTORATION SECTION is responsible for the identification, evaluation and remediation of sites in Delaware that have had past releases of hazardous substances. The section manages the contaminated sites under three major programs in accordance with the Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA). The three programs are the **Brownfields Development Program, the Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) and the HSCA Enforcement Program** (for sites requiring enforcement action).

The Brownfields Development Program encourages the cleanup and redevelopment of vacant, abandoned or underutilized properties, which may be contaminated. A party seeking to develop such a property negotiates with SIRS for a **Brownfields Development Agreement (BDA)** to perform an investigation and, if necessary, a remedial action or remedy, for the purpose of addressing the risks posed by past releases of hazardous substances at these sites. However, a BDA is only available to parties that are not current site owners. The **Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) Agreement** is available to site owners, who want to clean up their sites and are already liable as a potentially responsible party for the site.
