LEGAL NOTICE - RESCHEDULING PUBLIC HEARING

This notice is to cancel the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) Division of Air Quality public hearing scheduled for Wednesday June 27, 2018 in the Richardson & Robbins Building Auditorium due to water damage.

The public hearing is rescheduled for Thursday **July 12 beginning at 6:00 pm** at the Kent County Building at 555 South Bay Road in Dover, Delaware. At this hearing we will present proposed amendments to Delaware air regulations 7 DE Admin. Code 1101 and 1102 and a proposed source category permit.

This hearing is scheduled to receive public comments on a proposal to establish a permit process for outdoor dry abrasive blasting of water tanks with lead-containing coatings. In addition to the proposed regulatory changes, DNREC will also present for public comment the proposed source category permit that will be required for applicable projects.

Copies of the proposed regulatory amendments and the source category permit are available for public review at the Department's offices at 715 Grantham Lane in New Castle, DE and 100 West

DIVISION OF WASTE AND HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES

SITE INVESTIGATION AND RESTORATION SECTION (SIRS) is responsible for the identification, evaluation, and remediation of sites in Delaware that have had past releases of hazardous substances. The section manages the contaminated sites under three major programs in accordance with the Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA). The three programs are the **Brownfields Development Program, the Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP), and the HSCA Enforcement Program** (for sites requiring enforcement action).

The Brownfields Development Program encourages the cleanup and redevelopment of either the entire property, the expansion of the property, or the reuse of the property which may be hindered by the reasonable held belief that the property may be contaminated. A party seeking to develop such a property negotiates with SIRS for a **Brownfields Development Agreement (BDA)** to perform an investigation and, if necessary, a remedy, for the purpose of addressing the risks posed by past releases of hazardous substances at these sites. However, a BDA is only available to parties that are not current owners or operators of the site. The **Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) Agreement** is available to site owners who want to clean up their sites and are already liable as a potentially responsible party for the site.

LEGAL NOTICE - NOTIFICATION OF NEGOTIATIONS CONCERNING A VOLUNTARY AGREEMENT FOR THE POTTS PROPERTY SITE (DE-0169)

Pursuant to the June 2000 amendment to the Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA), 7 Del. C. § 9107 (a)(1), the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) is required to issue a public notice announcing the onset of negotiations concerning Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) Agreements, as well as any voluntary settlement agreements requiring a remedy, between DNREC and potentially responsible parties.

The amendment states that DNREC must provide "public notification within 20 days after entering into negotiations for a voluntary cleanup settlement agreement with any person that agrees to perform a remedy."

The Site Investigation and Restoration Section (SIRS), on behalf of DNREC, initiated the VCP in February 1995 in an effort to lessen the time and cost required in cleaning up contaminated sites by reducing litigation. VCP Agreements are available, upon application to DNREC, to potentially responsible parties or prospective purchasers who may be liable for the contamination of a property, but who wish to settle their liabilities with DNREC under HSCA.

DNREC is negotiating a VCP Agreement with Port Contractors, Inc regarding the Potts Property Site, Christina Avenue and I-495 in Wilmington, Delaware. The approximate 66 acre Site is identified on the maps of New Castle County as tax parcel numbers 26-063.00-014, 26-063.00-018, 26-063.00-019, 26-063.00-026 and 26-066.00-005. The Site requires remedial action due to the presence of elevated concentrations of arsenic in the sediment in the vicinity of the I-495 drainage ditch on portions of tax parcels 26-063.00-014 and 26-063.00-026. LEGAL NOTICE - AMENDED FINAL PLAN OF REMEDIAL ACTION FOR THE HUDSON PIT SITE (DE-0107)

The Department has adopted a plan regarding the clean-up the Hudson Pit Site located in Lewes. The Amended Final Plan will split the Site into three operable units. Operable Unit 1 (OU-1) is approximately 18 acres and requires excavation of arsenic contaminated soil. Operable Unit 2 (OU-2) is approximately 9 acres and requires excavation of oil sands. Operable Unit 3 (OU-3) encompasses the rest of the site, which is approximately 9 acres, and includes all of the groundwater for the Site. OU-3 requires groundwater monitoring after the redevelopment is complete. OU-1 and OU-2 have buried organic debris and biodegradable waste that must be removed from the known areas of the Site as encountered.

The Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control, Division of Water, hereby gives notice that Calpine Mid-Atlantic Generation, LLC has applied for reissuance of its National Pollutant Discharge System (NPDES) Permit No. DE0000558 (State Number WPCC 3011E/75) to discharge condenser cooling water, boiler blowdown, cooling tower blowdown, screen backwash, strainer backwash, and storm water from their facility located at 198 and 200 Hay Road, in Wilmington, New Castle County, to the Delaware River and Shellpot Creek. There are thirty one (31) outfalls at this site which discharge to the Delaware River and Shellpot Creek. Only stormwater outfalls discharge to Shellpot Creek. The facility generates electrical power from steam.

Based on a preliminary staff review and application of lawful standards and regulations, the Department proposes to re-issue this permit, subject to certain effluent limitations and conditions. The proposed determinations are tentative. Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the proposed determinations are invited to submit same in writing to the Surface Water Discharges Section of the Division of Water, at the address listed below, no later than 30 days from this notice. All comments received prior to said date will be considered in the formulation of final determinations regarding this application.

A public hearing on the above will NOT be held unless the Secretary of DNREC receives a request by 4:30 pm on **July 6**, or if the Secretary determines that a public hearing is in the public interest. A request for a hearing shall be in writing and shall state the nature of the issues to be raised at the hearing.
