Legal Notice Public Meeting - DNREC to host a public meeting on **July 16 at 10 AM** in Room A-112 of the Del Tech Stanton Campus near Newark to provide opportunity for public input on EPA proposal to deny Delaware's petitions to address the transport of emissions into Delaware. Delaware's Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control will host a public meeting on July 16, 2018 to provide an opportunity for Delawareans to comment on the US Environmental Protection Agency's proposal to deny Delaware's petitions to address upwind pollution that impacts Delaware's air quality. The meeting will begin at 10 a.m. at the Delaware Technical Community College 400 Stanton-Christiana Road Newark, Delaware 19713. Four petitions filed between July and November 2016 by DNREC under Section 126 of the federal Clean Air Act, sought EPA to require four power plants in Pennsylvania and West Virginia to reduce emissions that contribute to Delaware's high levels of smog in the summer. On June 8, 2018, EPA published its intent to conduct a public hearing on June 22, 2018, in Washington DC, for the purpose of receiving comments on EPA's proposal to deny the petitions. Due to the short notice and out-of-state location of the EPA hearing, DNREC's Division of Air Quality will host a public meeting "listening session" to receive comments from Delawareans that wish to comment on EPA's proposed action.

Comments received will be submitted in the form of a transcript to the EPA docket for comments. DNREC anticipates limiting each speaker to five minutes, but time may be adjusted, depending on the number of people who register to speak. Speakers are asked to register no later than July 12, 2018 by emailing Valerie Gray (Valerie.Gray@state.de.us). Written comments may be

Notice is hereby given that Delaware Recyclable Products, Inc. (DRPI) has submitted an application, pursuant to 7 DE Admin. Code 1102, Section 2.1, 11.2.9, and 12.3 for an amendment to their operating permit at 246 Marsh Lane, New Castle, Delaware.

DRPI requests to increase the limit on landfill gas (LFG) flow to the existing flare from 1,100 standard cubic feet per minute (scfm) to 1,200 scfm to improve control of increasing flows from the landfill gas extraction system. This amendment also incorporates requirements for work standards to reduce dust fugitives of their landfill operations. In addition to LFG flow rate DRPI requests a limit for Sulfur Oxides (SOX) emissions which remains at 87.0 tons per year (TPY). These limits are necessary to restrict DRPI's potential to emit air pollutants, and the limits will be enforceable by the EPA and the State. Total permitted emissions for the facility are 55.1 TPY of Carbon Monoxide (CO), 10.12 TPY of Nitrogen Oxides (NOX), 0.83 TPY of Non-Methane Organic Compounds (NMOC), 0.35 TPY of Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs), 2.1 TPY of Particulate Matter (PM) and 0.18 TPY of Hazardous Air Pollutants (HAPs).

BY THE DELAWARE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES AND ENVIRONMENTAL CONTROL DIVISION OF WASTE AND HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES SOLID & HAZARDOUS WASTE MANAGEMENT SECTION, 89 KINGS HIGHWAY, DOVER, DE 19901 OF THE INTENT TO CONTINUE POST-CLOSURE CARE OF THE WP21 LAND DISPOSAL UNIT UNDER THE DELAWARE REGULATIONS GOVERNING HAZARDOUS WASTE

Pursuant to 7 Del. C., Chapters 60 and 63, Delaware's Regulations Governing Hazardous Waste (DRGHW), the Delaware Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC), Solid & Hazardous Waste Management Section (SHWMS) has made a preliminary decision to issue a hazardous waste Post-Closure Permit to the Dover Air Force Base (DAFB), located at 600 Chevron Avenue in Dover, Delaware. The current Post-Closure Permit has expired, and, as required under the DRGHW, DAFB submitted an application to renew their post-closure permit in March 2016.

Dover Air Force Base (DAFB) is located in Kent County, Delaware about 3.5 miles southeast of the city of Dover. The installation encompasses 4,000 acres of land including annexes, easements, and leased property. The installation is bordered by commercial development and some residential complexes.

Base operations began in 1941 when the land was leased by the Eastern Defense Command to

use as a coastal patrol base. During World War II the base was expanded to accommodate heavy bombers and to serve as an operational training base for fighter pilots. The base was deactivated after the war and not reopened until 1950 when it was given the designation Dover Air Force Base. The present host organization is the 436th Airlift Wing, a part of Air Mobility Command (AMC). Its mission is to provide global airlift capabilities, including transport of cargo, troops, equipment, and relief supplies.

RCRA Hazardous Waste Site WP21 (a surface impoundment) is located in the central part of the industrial area in the western half of DAFB and is within the fenced boundary of the base. Because DAFB is a fenced installation with 24-hour manned security gates, the site is not accessible to the general public. Site WP21 is the location of a former system of industrial waste basins constructed in 1963 to receive wastewater from the engine overhaul shop (Building 719). The basins were located in the northwest corner of the installation adjacent to Atlantic Street and southwest of Building 719. The site is 263 feet long by 146 feet wide occupying an area of 0.88 acres. An underground pipeline from Building 719 emptied into a series of two primary basins constructed of concrete (also called the industrial waste basins [IWBs]). The total capacity of these two basins was 12,000 gallons. The influent wastewater passed through an oil/water separator from which the oil was siphoned off and held in a 15,000-gallon above-ground holding tank. The remaining water passed through two unlined secondary settling basins (unlined surface impoundments or lagoons) with a volumetric capacity of 170,000 gallons, occupying an area of 0.52 acres. In 1968, wastes from the Metal Plating Shop (Building 724) and the aircraft wash racks (Building 582) were also routed to the basins.

In 1982, analysis of groundwater samples collected immediately hydraulically downgradient of WP-21 indicated that the uppermost aquifer was contaminated with VOCs, most notably chlorinated solvents.

DNREC has taken several enforcement actions associated with groundwater monitoring activities, beginning with Secretary's Order No. 87-HW-03, issued on November 19, 1987. These actions have required DAFB to develop and implement a Subpart F groundwater monitoring and corrective action program under a Post-Closure Permit (PCP).

DNREC/DAFB have modified groundwater related components of the PCP several times to address evolving remedial action alternatives and associated adjustments to the groundwater monitoring network. Most of these changes came about following realization that the WP-21 solvent plume was only one of a series of solvent plumes underlying the western portion of the Base and identified under the Superfund program.

The cleanup objectives of associated Superfund RODs and the RCRA PCP are the same, and the groundwater monitoring is performed for both programs using the same monitoring network. The interim remedial objective of the monitoring program is to confirm that natural attenuation processes occur at rates sufficient to meet the groundwater protection standard set forth in the PCP (and the RAO of Superfund). DNREC proposes to issue a new permit to continue hazardous waste post-closure activities at a closed hazardous-waste land disposal unit at this facility.

Persons wishing to comment upon the draft permit application are invited to submit written comments. The written comments must be received no later than Friday, **August 10**. Comments must be sent to DNREC, RE: DE8570024010; File Code: 16 at the address listed at the beginning of this notice. All written comments received prior to the end of the forty-five (45) day comment period will be considered when formulating the final determination. A public hearing may be held if the Department receives a meritorious request for a hearing prior to the Friday, August 10, 2018 deadline, or if the Secretary deems it to be in the best interest of the State to do so. The post-closure draft permit is on file and may be reviewed at the Dover office of DNREC (89 Kings Highway) or the New Castle office of DNREC (391 Lukens Drive). SITE INVESTIGATION AND RESTORATION SECTION (SIRS) is responsible for the identification, evaluation, and remediation of sites in Delaware that have had past releases of hazardous substances. The section manages the contaminated sites under three major programs in accordance with the Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA). The three programs are the **Brownfields Development Program, the Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP), and the HSCA Enforcement Program** (for sites requiring enforcement action).
