DIVISION OF WASTE AND HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES

SITE INVESTIGATION AND RESTORATION SECTION (SIRS) is responsible for the identification, evaluation, and remediation of sites in Delaware that have had past releases of hazardous substances. The section manages the contaminated sites under three major programs in accordance with the Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA). The three programs are the **Brownfields Development Program**, the **Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP)**, and the **HSCA Enforcement Program** (for sites requiring enforcement action).

The Brownfields Development Program encourages the cleanup and redevelopment of either the entire property, the expansion of the property, or the reuse of the property which may be hindered by the reasonable held belief that the property may be contaminated. A party seeking to develop such a property negotiates with SIRS for a **Brownfields Development Agreement (BDA)** to perform an investigation and, if necessary, a remedy, for the purpose of addressing the risks posed by past releases of hazardous substances at these sites. However, a BDA is only available to parties that are not current owners or operators of the site. The **Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) Agreement** is available to site owners who want to clean up their sites and are already liable as a potentially responsible party for the site.

NOTIFICATION OF PUBLIC COMMENT FOR A BROWNFIELDS DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT FOR THE WILMINGTON PIECE DYE – LOWER PARCEL SITE (DE-1304)

Pursuant to the Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA), 7 Del. C. Chapter 91, §9126, the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) is required to issue a public notice within twenty days after entering into negotiations for a Brownfield Development Agreement (BDA). A BDA is an agreement between DNREC and a Brownfield developer with respect to a Certified Brownfield Site that sets forth a scope of work and schedule of remedial activities during the development of the Site. DNREC's Site Investigation and Restoration Section (DNREC-SIRS) negotiated a BDA with

Rockford Cap, LLC regarding the Wilmington Piece Dye – Lower Parcel Site located at 1 Mill Road and 165 Bancroft Mills Road in Wilmington and identified by New Castle County as tax parcel numbers 26-006.20-041, -084 and -045. LEGAL NOTICE - Amended FINAL PLAN OF REMEDIAL ACTION FOR THE Sussex Lumber Site (Operable Unit 1 and 2) (DE-0118)

The Department has adopted a plan regarding the clean-up of the Sussex Lumber Site located at Tract 1B Robinsonville Road in Lewes. The approximately 7 acre Site was used as a lumber preparation, treatment, and storage facility. Due to the treatment of the lumber, the Site is contaminated with arsenic and hexavalent chromium. Site soil is also contaminated with polynuclear aromatic hydrocarbons from the Site's use as a commercial property. The Site requires limited excavation and capping as well as limiting groundwater use.

DNREC issued public notice of the Amended Proposed Plan for the Sussex Lumber Site on July 11, 2018. There were no comments or questions from the public regarding the Amended Proposed Plan. LEGAL NOTICE - PROPOSED PLAN OF REMEDIAL ACTION FOR THE HAMILTON PARK/PYLES LANE SITE – OPERABLE UNITS 29, 30, and 31 (DE-1284)

The Department invites public comment on a proposal to cleanup Operable Units (OUs) – 29, 30, and 31 of the Hamilton Park/Pyles Lane Site, a residential neighborhood located in New Castle. Fill material placed before the houses were constructed, as well as remnants of foundry operations previously located in the rear of the neighborhood, are the likely sources of elevated metals and polycyclic aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs) detected within the top 0 to 2 feet below ground surface (bgs). The plan includes the removal of soil within the top two feet bgs in select areas within each operable unit.

LEGAL NOTICE - AMENDED PROPOSED PLAN OF REMEDIAL ACTION FOR THE Amer Industrial TECHNOLOGIES OU-2

The Department invites public comment on a proposal to clean up the Amer Industrial Technologies Operable Unit 2 (OU-2) located at 100 Amer Road, Fox Point Industrial Park in Wilmington, Delaware. The Site consists of two (2) tax parcels totaling 25 acres located on the western banks of the Delaware River. Soil is impacted by lead over DNREC soil standards for residential use of the property. Groundwater is impacted by lead but surface water has not been impacted.

The remedy consisted of: 1) an environmental covenant restricting land use to commercial, limiting groundwater withdrawal, compliance with a contaminated material management plan (CMMP), 2) a CMMP for new construction or soil disturbing activities, 3) Excavate lead in Lead Area 1, consolidate and cap Lead Area 2, 4) Cap soil in Lead Area 3, and 5) Develop a DNREC approved Long-Term Stewardship (LTS) Plan to monitor the groundwater and cap.

LEGAL NOTICE - DNREC – Division of Water, Surface Water Discharges Section, NPDES Permits

The Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control, Division of Water, hereby gives notice of the following proposal regarding National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permits:

The Board of Public Works of the City of Lewes has filed a timely and sufficient application for reissuance of its NPDES Permit No. DE0021512 (State Number WPCC 3075H/74) to discharge treated wastewater from its sanitary wastewater treatment facilities to the Lewes segment of the Lewes-Rehoboth Canal from its facilities located at 116 American Legion Road, Lewes, Sussex County, Delaware. The facility is a municipal wastewater treatment facility that receives wastewater from the City collection system, provides treatment, and discharges to the Lewes segment of the Lewes-Rehoboth Canal. The facility is designated as major publicly owned treatment works (POTW) based on the design flow of over one million gallons per day. There are no industrial waste contributors to the collection system, and no combined sewer overflows (CSO). The permittee has identified 2 discharge points at the facility in the permit application. Outfall 001 consists of sanitary wastewater. Wastewater treatment consists of a 5 millimeter (mm) band screen, grit removal, flow equalization, 2 mm band screen, membrane biofiltration process, and U.V disinfection. Waste sludge is stabilized, dried on porous asphalt drying beds and/or vacuum sludge press, and disposed at a landfill. One storm water outfall (SW001) also discharges from the site.

Based on a preliminary staff review and application of lawful standards and regulations, the Department proposes to re-issue this permit, subject to certain effluent limitations and conditions. The proposed determinations are tentative. Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the proposed determinations are invited to submit same in writing to the Surface Water Discharges Section of the Division of Water, at the address listed below, no later than 30 days from this notice. All comments received prior to said date will be considered in the formulation of final determinations regarding this application.

A public hearing on the above will NOT be held unless the Secretary of DNREC receives a request by **4:30 pm, September 21**, or if the Secretary determines that a public hearing is in the public interest. The Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control, Division of Water, hereby gives notice of the following proposal regarding National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) permits:

Indian River Power LLC has filed a timely and sufficient application for reissuance of its NPDES Permit No. DE0050580 (State Number WPCC 3013D/76) to discharge cooling tower blowdown, screen backwash, industrial wastewater treatment effluent, strainer backwash, and storm water to Island Creek, a tributary to Indian River, and Indian River Bay from its facilities located at 29416 Power Plant Road in Dagsboro, Sussex County, Delaware. The Indian River Generating Station (IRGS) is a coal fired steam electric generating plant. The IRGS began commercial operation in November 1957 and at its peak had four generating units with a combined generating capacity of approximately 771 Megawatts. The older generating units (Units 1, 2, and 3) which employed once through cooling systems were shut down just prior to or during the term of the current permit. Unit 4 is the only steam electric generating unit in operation at the IRGS. Unit 4 utilizes mechanical draft closed cycle cooling (a "closed-cycle recirculating system" per USEPA's 316(b) regulation) for all of its cooling needs. The permittee has identified 11 discharge points at the facility in the permit application. Outfall 027 consists of Unit #4 Cooling Tower Blowdown. Outfall 029 consists of Unit #4 Screen Backwash. Outfall 030 consists of Industrial Wastewater Treatment Effluent. Outfalls 031, 032, 033, 034, 035, 037, 042, and 045 consist of storm water only. All but one of the outfalls discharges directly or via the Discharge Canal and/or Island Creek to the Indian River. The one exception is Outfall 030 which discharges to the Cooling Tower Basin where it is recycled for use in the Unit 4 cooling tower.

Based on a preliminary staff review and application of lawful standards and regulations, the Department proposes to re-issue this permit, subject to certain effluent limitations and conditions. The proposed determinations are tentative. Persons wishing to comment upon or object to the proposed determinations are invited to submit same in writing to the Surface Water Discharges Section of the Division of Water, at the address listed below, no later than 30 days from this notice. All comments received prior to said date will be considered in the formulation of final determinations regarding this application.
