## **UPCOMING AIR & WASTE, RELATED HEARINGS, MEETINGS, & EVENTS**

### **LEGAL NOTICE - PUBLIC WORKSHOPS**

The Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC), Division of Air Quality (DAQ) and Division of Waste and Hazardous Substances, Tank Management Section (TMS) will jointly conduct a public workshop to introduce to the public their current efforts on revising the following regulations:

- 7 DE Admin. Code 1124 Section 26 "Gasoline Dispensing Facility Stage I Vapor Recovery" and Section 36 "Vapor Emission Control at Gasoline Dispensing Facilities."
- 7 DE Admin. Code 1351 "Underground Storage Tank Systems"

The workshop will be held on **Tuesday, April 16, 2019 at two locations as follows**, and the public can participate at either location:

**1. Beginning at 10:00 AM in TMS Conference Room, located at 391 Lukens Drive, New Castle, DE 19720.**

**2. Beginning at 6:30 PM in DNREC Auditorium, located at Richardson & Robbins Building, 89 Kings Highway, Dover, DE 19901.**

The objectives of revising 7 DE Admin. Code 1124 Section 26 and Section 36 are (1) to phase out Stage II vapor recovery systems at Delaware Gasoline Dispensing Facilities (GDFs), and (2) to set up effective controls on vapor emission from GDFs' gasoline underground storage tanks (USTs) after phasing out Stage II.

The objective of revising 7 DE Admin. Code 1351 is to reflect advances in underground storage tank system technology and changes required due to promulgation of new federal underground storage tank regulations. The State of Delaware regulations must be at least as stringent as the federal regulations under the requirements of 40 CFR 281, State Program Approval.

The draft language of 7 DE Admin. Code 1124 Section 26 and Section 36 shall be available for public review prior to the workshop in DAQ's offices at (1) 715 Grantham Lane, New Castle, DE, and (2) 100 W. Water Street, Suite 6A, Dover, DE. The draft language will be also available from DAQ's website at <https://dnrec.alpha.delaware.gov/air/permitting/under-development/>.

The draft language of 7 DE Admin. Code 1351 shall be available for public review prior to the workshop date in TMS's offices 391 Lukens Drive, New Castle, DE. The draft language is also available at TMS' website at <http://www.dnrec.delaware.gov/tanks/Pages/default.aspx>.

### **Title V Permit Renewal Applications**

#### **LEGAL NOTICE - TITLE V SYNTHETIC MINOR PERMIT APPLICATIONS**

Notice is hereby given that Orient Corporation of America has submitted an application, pursuant to 7 DE Admin. Code 1102, Section 2.1, 11.2.9, and 12.3 for operation of one (1) 20.412 MMBTU/hr natural gas-fired Cleaver Brooks Model CBLE 700-500-350 ST boiler equipped with low NOX burners (LNB) and flue gas recirculation (FGR) control technologies at 111 Park Avenue in Seaford, Delaware.

Orient Corporation of America has accepted limitations in order to limit the emissions of volatile organic compounds (VOCs) and hazardous air pollutants (HAPs) below the major source threshold for Sussex County. These limits are necessary to restrict Orient Corporation of America potential to emit air pollutants, and the limit will be enforceable by the EPA and the state. The facility, as a whole, has potential estimated emissions up to 6.42 tons per year (TPY) of nitrogen oxides (NOX), 12.06 TPY of carbon monoxide (CO), 0.09 TPY of sulfur oxides (SOX), 0.89 TPY of particulate matter (PM), 0.54 TPY of VOCs/HAPs, and 25.10 TPY of ammonia (NH3). This includes the new boiler which is estimated to emit up to 0.71 pounds per hour and 3.13 TPY of NOX, 2.25 pounds per hour and 9.83 TPY of CO, 0.20 pounds per hour and 0.89 TPY of PM, 0.02 pounds per hour and 0.09 TPY of SOX, and 0.08 pounds per hour and 0.36 TPY of VOCs.

## **DIVISION OF WASTE AND HAZARDOUS SUBSTANCES**

**SITE INVESTIGATION AND RESTORATION SECTION (SIRS)** is responsible for the identification, evaluation, and remediation of sites in Delaware that have had past releases of hazardous substances. The section manages the contaminated sites under three major programs in accordance with the Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA). The three programs are the **Brownfields Development Program, the Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP), and the HSCA Enforcement Program** (for sites requiring enforcement action).

**The Brownfields Development Program** encourages the cleanup and redevelopment of either the entire property, the expansion of the property, or the reuse of the property which may be hindered by the reasonable held belief that the property may be contaminated. A party seeking to develop such a property negotiates with SIRS for a **Brownfields Development Agreement (BDA)** to perform an investigation and, if necessary, a remedy, for the purpose of addressing the risks posed by past releases of hazardous substances at these sites. However, a BDA is only available to parties that are not current owners or operators of the site. The **Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) Agreement** is available to site owners who want to clean up their sites and are already liable as a potentially responsible party for the site.

## **LEGAL NOTICE - NOTIFICATION OF NEGOTIATIONS CONCERNING A VOLUNTARY AGREEMENT FOR THE SUSSEX LUMBER SITE, DE-0118**

The Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA), 7 Del. C. § 9107 (a)(1), requires the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) to provide "public notification within 20 days after entering into negotiations for a voluntary cleanup settlement agreement (VCP) with any person that agrees to perform a remedy."

### **LEGAL NOTICE - FINAL PLAN OF REMEDIAL ACTION FOR THE 2002 – 2012 WEST NEWPORT PIKE (DE-1665)**

The Department has adopted a plan regarding the clean-up of the 2002 – 2012 West Newport Pike Site located in Wilmington, outside the municipal boundaries of the City of Wilmington, in New Castle County, Delaware. The Site, was historically occupied by a dry cleaning facility from the late 1960s to the early 1980s. Multiple environmental investigations of the Site identified a groundwater plume of chlorinated solvents in the southern and southwestern portions of the Site. Additional off-site environmental investigations have determined that the impacted groundwater has migrated onto the adjoining properties to the south and southwest, and is being addressed through land use restrictions.

DNREC issued public notice of the Proposed Plan for the 2002 – 2012 West Newport Pike Site on February 17, 2019. There were no comments or questions from the public regarding the Proposed Plan.
