NOTIFICATION OF PUBLIC HEARING FOR THE General Motors Corp. Wilmington Assembly Plant, OU- 5 (DE-1149)

Pursuant to the Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA), 7 Del. C. § 9112, the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control's Site Investigation and Restoration Section (DNREC-SIRS) has scheduled a public hearing regarding the Proposed Plan of Remedial Action (Proposed Plan) for the Wilmington Assembly Plant, Operable Unit 5 (OU-5) located in

Wilmington, Delaware.

DNREC-SIRS held a public workshop regarding the Proposed Plan on January 16, 2019 and received a request for a public hearing. The Proposed Plan recommended DNREC's proposed remedial actions for OU-5 where the site soil was impacted by antimony, arsenic, cadmium, and lead. Groundwater was impacted by arsenic, barium, cobalt, iron, manganese, benzene, ethylbenzene, and naphthalene. There is no offsite impact from groundwater.

LEGAL NOTICE - TITLE V SYNTHETIC MINOR PERMIT APPLICATIONS

Notice is hereby given that Bracebridge Corporation (A Wholly Owned Subsidiary of Bank of America) – Deerfield Complex has submitted an application, pursuant to 7 DE Admin. Code 1102, Section 2.1, 11.2.9, and 12.3 for an amendment to their operating permit for their facility located at 655 Paper Mill Road, Newark, Delaware.

Bracebridge-Deerfield Complex requests a permit amendment to increase the operational hours for six (6) emergency generators currently located at the facility. The requested increase is due to the local utility performing a substation transformer upgrade project in which the utility service will need to be interrupted as the equipment is replaced. The increase in the operational hours for the emergency generators will prevent a forced shutdown of critical facilities and business operations. In addition, revisions to the operational and emissions limits of the boilers and miscellaneous fuel burning equipment have also been included in the requested permit amendment. Total permitted emissions for the facility are 22.50 TPY of Nitrogen Oxides (NOX), 8.40 TPY of Carbon Monoxide (CO), 0.90 TPY of Total Hydrocarbons (THC), 0.30 TPY of Sulfur Oxides (SOX), and 1.00 TPY of Particulate Matter (PM10). These limits are necessary to restrict Bracebridge's potential to emit air pollutants, and the limits will be enforceable by both the EPA, and the State.

SITE INVESTIGATION AND RESTORATION SECTION (SIRS) is responsible for the identification, evaluation, and remediation of sites in Delaware that have had past releases of hazardous substances. The section manages the contaminated sites under three major programs in accordance with the

Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA). The three programs are the **Brownfields Development Program, the Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP), and the HSCA Enforcement Program** (for sites requiring enforcement action).

LEGAL NOTICE - NOTIFICATION OF NEGOTIATIONS CONCERNING A VOLUNTARY AGREEMENT FOR THE DRY CLEAN CENTRAL OFF SITE CONTAMINATION (DE-1694)

The Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA), 7 Del. C. § 9107 (a)(1), requires the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC) to provide “public notification within 20 days after entering into negotiations for a voluntary cleanup settlement agreement with any person that agrees to perform a remedy.”

As required by §9107(a)(1), DNREC advises that it is negotiating a VCP Agreement with Kings Highway Land Partners, LLC regarding the Dry Clean Central Offsite Contamination Site (DE-1694). The groundwater contamination plume originates from the Site located at 122 N DuPont Highway, Dover, DE. The Brownfields Development Program encourages the cleanup and redevelopment of either the entire property, the expansion of the property, or the reuse of the property which may be hindered by the reasonable held belief that the property may be contaminated. A party seeking to develop such a property negotiates with SIRS for a **Brownfields Development Agreement (BDA)** to perform an investigation and, if necessary, a remedy, for the purpose of addressing the risks posed by past releases of hazardous substances at these sites. However, a BDA is only available to parties that are not current owners or operators of the site. The **Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) Agreement** is available to site owners who want to clean up their sites and are already liable as a potentially responsible party for the site.

LEGAL NOTICE - FINAL PLAN OF REMEDIAL ACTION FOR THE CAVALIERS COUNTRY CLUB - OPERABLE UNIT 1b Site (DE-1600)

The Department invited public comment on a proposal to clean-up Cavaliers Country Club - Operable Unit 1B (OU-1B or Site) located at 100 Addison Drive in Newark. The Site is part of a former 18-hole golf course that has been divided into three operable units, OU-1A, OU-1B, and OU-2, to facilitate cleanup and redevelopment. Cavaliers Country Club-OU-1B consists of approximately 70 acres located on the eastern half of the 18-hole golf course including the club house and parking lot.

Cavaliers Country Club-OU-1B will be subject to the following remedial actions: the submittal of a Remedial Action Work Plan, which specifies the methods to be used to remediate the Site including the removal and disposal of primarily arsenic-impacted soils, blending of arsenic-impacted soils, or capping with impervious material (e.g., buildings, asphalt, or concrete) to meet DNREC Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA) standards for all contaminants; and the recording of an Environmental Covenant restricting property use to non-residential at certain locations, restrict interference with remedy at those locations, limiting groundwater withdrawal, requiring compliance with the Long-Term Stewardship (LTS) Plan, and compliance with the Contaminated Materials Management Plan (CMMP).

DNREC issued public notice of the Proposed Plan for the Cavaliers Country Club OU-1B Site on January 6, 2019. There were no comments or questions from the public regarding the Proposed

The Department invited public comment on a proposal to clean-up Cavaliers Country Club - Operable Unit 1A (OU-1A or Site) located at 100 Addison Drive in Newark. The Site is part of a former 18-hole golf course that has been divided into three operable units, OU-1A, OU-1B, and OU-2, to facilitate cleanup and redevelopment. Cavaliers Country Club-OU-1A consists of approximately 72 acres located on the western half of the 18-hole golf course, and a portion of the eastern half of the golf course for use as utility corridors, a walking path, and open space. Cavaliers Country Club-OU-1A will be subject to the following remedial actions: the submittal of a Remedial Action Work Plan, which specifies the methods to be used to remediate the Site including the removal and disposal of primarily arsenic-impacted soils, blending of arsenic-impacted soils, or capping with impervious material (e.g., buildings, asphalt, or concrete) to meet DNREC Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA) standards for all contaminants; and the recording of an Environmental Covenant restricting property use to non-residential at certain locations, restrict interference with remedy at those locations, limiting groundwater withdrawal, requiring compliance with the Long-Term Stewardship (LTS) Plan, and compliance with the Contaminated Materials Management Plan (CMMP).
