NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING The Department will conduct a public hearing on a proposed State Plan and amendment to existing Regulation No. 1120 New Source Performance Standards to add a new standard (Section 30) that is applicable to municipal solid waste landfills (MSWLs). On August 29, 2016, the EPA promulgated two regulations applicable to MSWLs. The EPA promulgated 40 CFR Part 60 Subpart XXX, which regulates the emissions from new (i.e., newly constructed, reconstructed, or modified) MSWLs and 40 CFR Part 60 Subpart Cf, which requires States to regulate emissions from existing MSWLs. The purpose of these two federal regulations is to reduce volatile organic compounds (VOCs) and methane emissions from MSWLs. DNREC is proposing to incorporate the federal new MSWL requirements in Subpart XXX by reference as Section 30 of Regulation No. 1120. To satisfy the existing MSWL requirements of Subpart Cf, the applicability of Section 30 will be expanded to include both existing and new MSWLs. Once finalized, Section 30 and the State Plan will be submitted to the EPA for approval. There are three MSWLs in Delaware; all are operated by the Delaware Solid Waste Authority and will be subject to the State Plan and amended regulation. The public hearing on this proposed State Plan and amendment of Regulation No. 1120 will be held on April 24 beginning at 6:00PM in the Department's office located at 100 W. Water Street, Suite 6A, Dover, The proposed amendment and the State Plan are available for public review (1) at the Department's office at 715 Grantham Lane in New Castle; (2) at the Department's office at 100 W. LEGAL NOTICE- the Wetlands and Subaqueous Lands Section of the Division of Water has renewed a "Statewide Activity Approval (SAA) for Sediment Removal From Streams in New Castle County" pursuant to the provisions of 7 Del. C., 7203, and the Department's Regulations Governing the Use of Subaqueous Lands, effectively immediately. The SAA authorizes the removal of accumulated sediment, above or below the water's surface, that is associated with debris jams, bridge crossings, culverted road crossings, outfall structures and dams in subaqueous lands in New Castle County, that are jurisdictional under the Subaqueous Lands Act. The SAA permits these activities provided the activity is performed by New Castle County (NCCo), the New Castle Conservation District (NCCD), the City of Newark, the Delaware Department of Transportation (North District and Canal District), the Department or their contractors, according to the terms and conditions of the SAA. The intent of the SAA is to reduce response times by the permitted agencies in clearing debris jams and excessive sediment deposits for the purpose of alleviating flood-related storm damage to stream-side properties. Projects qualifying for approval under the SAA require prior notification to the Department except in emergencies, and in some instances, will invoke an abbreviated review process for a decision by the Department. PUBLIC HEARING The Groundwater Discharges Section (GWDS) will be conducting a public hearing regarding the proposed amendments to the State of Delaware Regulations Governing Underground Injection Control (UIC Regulations). The public hearing will take place on **May 25**, at 6:00 P.M., in the Richardson & Robbins Auditorium (89 Kings Hwy, Dover). The Start Action Notice to adopt the proposed amendments to the UIC Regulations was signed by then-Secretary Collin O'Mara on November 28, 2012. The proposed amendments include prohibiting large-capacity cesspools and motor vehicle disposal wells (floor drains) which are connected to on-site wastewater treatment and disposal systems. WHS - SITE INVESTIGATION AND RESTORATION SECTION (SIRS) is responsible for the identification, evaluation, and remediation of sites in Delaware that have had past releases of hazardous substances. The section manages the contaminated sites under three major programs in accordance with the Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA). The three programs are the **Brownfields Development Program, the Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP), and the HSCA Enforcement Program** (for sites requiring enforcement action).

The Brownfields Development Program encourages the cleanup and redevelopment of vacant, abandoned, or underutilized properties, which may be contaminated. A party seeking to develop such a property negotiates with SIRS for a **Brownfields Development Agreement (BDA)** to perform an investigation and, if necessary, a remedial action or remedy, for the purpose of addressing the risks posed by past releases of hazardous substances at these sites. However, a BDA is only available to parties that are not current site owners. The **Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) Agreement** is available to site owners who want to clean up their sites and are already liable as a potentially responsible party for the site.
