**NOTICE HAS BEEN GIVEN THAT ALLEN HARIM FARMS, LLC**, requests construction and operation permits to install additional equipment and increase production in accordance with the permits described below for an expansion to their feedmill at their 20799 Allen Road, Seaford, Sussex County facility. **SITE INVESTIGATION AND RESTORATION SECTION** – The Division's Site Investigation and Restoration Section (SIRS) is responsible for the identification, evaluation and remediation of sites in Delaware that have had past releases of hazardous substances. The Section manages the contaminated sites under three major programs in accordance with the Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA). The three programs are the Brownfields Development Program, the Voluntary Cleanup Program (VCP) and the HSCA Enforcement Program (for sites requiring enforcement action).

#### **NOTIFICATION OF NEGOTIATIONS AND PUBLIC COMMENT FOR A BROWNFIELDS DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT FOR THE LIQUID ALCHEMY SITE (DE-1605)**
