Just for clarification (Green Delaware has no connection with the recommendations from Mr. Fiorentino and has not been consulted by any of the "enviro" members of this group. Therefore, we consider that our interests are not represented.):

Item 3 says:

"The balance of the auction proceeds (75%) would be used to establish and implement a Delaware Affordable Utilities (DAU) program, and other activities authorized under the RGGI MOU. The DAU program would be designed to provide assistance to low-income Delaware residents with the cost of electric, fuel oil and natural gas service. Qualifying home-owners requesting assistance would be eligible to receive contractor-provided weatherization services and materials, including insulation, energy efficient replacement windows and doors, and energy efficient heating and cooling systems, and other energy conservation and efficiency systems, at no cost. This program would be administered in conjunction with the existing Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) and the Weatherization Program."

Do I understand this to mean that low-income residents would or could receive help in paying their bills through this fund (Sentence two)?

Or does it mean only that low-income homeowners could receive weatherization assistance (sentence three)?

We would appreciate a clarification.
