

## SECTION 6 PUBLIC WORKSHOP

### Key Definitions

**Hazardous air pollutants (HAPs)** are any air pollutant listed in or pursuant to Section 112(b) of the Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990. HAPs are also called air toxics. Chromium compounds are listed in Section 112(b).

**New affected source** is any operation that is subject to Section 6 and that construction or reconstruction commenced after February 8, 2012.

**Existing affected source** is any operation that is subject to Section 6 and that construction or reconstruction commenced on or prior to February 8, 2012.

**Affirmative defense** is, in the context of an enforcement proceeding, a response or a defense put forward by a defendant, regarding which the defendant has the burden of proof, and the merits of which are independently and objectively evaluated in a judicial or administrative proceeding.

**Malfunction** is any sudden, infrequent, and not reasonably preventable failure of air pollution control and monitoring equipment, process equipment, or a process to operate in a normal or usual manner which causes, or has the potential to cause, the emission limitations in an applicable standard to be exceeded. Failures that are caused in part by poor maintenance or careless operation are not malfunctions.
