DNREC issued public notice of the Proposed Plan of Remedial Action (Proposed Plan) for the Nanticoke Homes Operable Unit 2 Site on October 15, 2013 and opened a 20-day public comment period. The Proposed Plan is attached. There were no comments from the public; therefore, the Proposed Plan is adopted as the Final Plan.



### **What is the Proposed Plan of Remedial Action?**

The Proposed Plan of Remedial Action (Proposed Plan) summarizes the clean-up (remedial) actions that are being proposed to address contamination found at the Site for public comment. A legal notice is published in the newspaper for a 20-day comment period. DNREC considers and addresses all public comments received and publish a Final Plan of Remedial Action (Final Plan) for the Site.

### **What is the Nanticoke Homes OU-2?**


Figure 1: Site Location Map

The Nanticoke Homes site is located at on US 13 north of Greenwood, Delaware, and consists of five tax parcels (530-5.00-29.00, 530-5.00-31.00, 530-5.00-31.02, 530-5.00-4.01, and 530-5.00-4.02), totaling approximately 61.84 acres (Figure 1). Nanticoke Homes OU-1 is tax parcel 530-5.00-31.00. Nanticoke Homes OU-2 is tax parcel IDs 530-5.00-29.00, 530-5.00-31.00, 530-5.00-31.02, 530-5.00-4.01, and 530-5.00-4.02.

The nearest intersection to the Site is Greenwood Road and Route 13. The Site consists of multiple office/warehouse buildings, gravel/asphalt parking area and is zoned commercial (Figure 2).

This proposed plan addresses Nanticoke Homes OU-2 (Site) (Figure 2). There was no contamination above DNREC-SIRS residential standards found at Nanticoke Homes OU-2.

### **What happened at the Nanticoke Homes OU-2?**

A remedial investigation was conducted at Nanticoke Homes in 2004 to address concerns about contamination that may have been present at the Site. However, no contamination above DNREC-SIRS residential standards found at Nanticoke Homes OU-2.

### **What is the environmental problem at the Nanticoke Homes OU-2?**

No contamination above DNREC-SIRS residential standards is present at Nanticoke Homes OU-2.

### **What clean-up actions have been taken at the Nanticoke Homes OU-2?**

No interim actions have been conducted on Nanticoke Homes OU-2.

### **What does the owner want to do at the Nanticoke Homes OU-2?**

There are no plans to change the Site or Site use. The Site will continue to be used for office space and manufacturing activities.

### **What additional clean-up actions are needed at the Nanticoke Homes OU-2?**

No remedial actions are necessary since no contamination above DNREC-SIRS residential standards is present at Nanticoke Homes OU-2. A No Further Action Certificate of Completion of Remedy (COCR) can be issued.

### **What are the long term plans for Nanticoke Homes OU-2 after the cleanup?**

The Site is currently used by Beracah Homes, Inc. to build manufactured homes. There is no planned change in Site use.

### **How can I find additional information or comment on the Proposed Plan?**



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## Glossary of Terms Used in this Proposed Plan

<b>Environmental Covenant</b>	Land Use control place on a property deed to restrict the use of the property to protect human health or the environment.
<b>Remedial Investigation (RI)</b>	Thorough environmental study of a site which includes 1) sampling of site environmental media and/or wastes on the property and 2) conducting a preliminary risk assessment using the data collected to determine the risk posed to human health and the environment.
<b>Certification of Completion of Remedy (COCR)</b>	A formal determination by the Secretary of DNREC that remedial activities required by the Final Plan of Remedial Action have been completed.
<b>Contaminant of Concern (COC)</b>	Potentially harmful substances at concentrations above acceptable levels.
<b>Exposure</b>	Contact with a substance through inhalation, ingestion, or direct contact with the skin. Exposure may be short term (acute) or long term (chronic).
<b>Proposed/Final Plan of Remedial Action</b>	DNREC's adopted plan for cleaning up a hazardous site.
<b>Hazardous Substance Cleanup Act (HSCA)</b>	Delaware Code Title 7, Chapter 91. The law that enables DNREC to identify parties responsible for hazardous substances releases and requires cleanup with oversight of the Department.
<b>Operable Unit</b>	Term for each of a number of separate activities/areas addressed as part of a Superfund site cleanup.
<b>Risk</b>	Likelihood or probability of injury, disease, or death.
<b>Restricted Use</b>	Commercial or Industrial setting
<b>SIRS</b>	Site Investigation Restoration Section of DNREC, which oversees cleanup of sites that were contaminated as a result of past use, from dry cleaners to chemical companies.
<b>Semi-Volatile Organic Compounds (SVOCs)</b>	A semi-volatile organic compound is an organic compound which has a boiling point higher than water and which may vaporize when exposed to temperatures above room temperature. SVOCs include phenols and polynuclear aromatic hydrocarbons (PAHs).
<b>Uniform Risk-Based Remediation Standards (URS)</b>	A set of concentration criteria for various contaminants potentially present in site media that are developed for protection of human health and the environment
<b>US EPA</b>	United States Environmental Protection Agency
<b>Volatile Organic Compounds (VOCs)</b>	VOCs are organic chemicals that have a high vapor pressure and form vapors at normal temperature and pressure.
