


Please Recycle Your Fishing Line



What can I do to help?
It is as easy as collecting your used fishing line, removing all hooks and tackle, and placing the fishing line into the recycling bins.


Where are the recycling bins located?
We have placed the monofilament fishing line recycling bins at several locations including; Killens Pond, Moores Lake, McGinnis Pond, Garrisons Lake and the Nanticoke River.



How does the program work?

The recycling bins are emptied by our volunteers and the monofilament line is returned to the

manufacturers at no cost. Monofilament line is re-melted and made into new products such as spools for new fishing line and even fish structures.



The benefits of recycling your fishing line include:

- a cleaner environment.
- prevention of entanglement for fish and wildlife species.
- recycling fishing line into new products.

Lets all work together to promote conservation and recycling!
