



GENERAL DOG TRAINING REGULATIONS

1. Dog training activities restricted to designated areas March 1– August 31 (See attached map). From September 1-February 28 dog training permitted on any suitable area within the C&D Canal Wildlife Area during open hunting seasons for the game that the dog is being trained to hunt.
2. During field trial and organized training events, permitted by the Division, dog training areas may be closed to the public. A signage system at appropriate access areas will be used to provide notice when a permitted field trial or training event is occurring.
3. No permits needed to train dogs on dog training areas provided live birds are not being used. If live birds are used a dog training permit is required (Call 302-739-9912).
4. Motorized vehicles are prohibited off established and maintained roadways including within dog training areas.
5. Firearms prohibited on lands administered by the Division from March 1 – August 31, except during legal hunting seasons or on areas established as a designated dog training area.
6. Target shooting is prohibited.
7. No rifles permitted

SUMMIT RETRIEVER TRAINING AREA

1. The Division has established a retriever training area along the northside of the canal between Route 896 and Guthrie Run (a.k.a The Waterfall). This area is restricted to the training of sporting dogs in the act of retrieving (See attached map).
2. In a cooperative stewardship agreement, the Delaware Bay Retriever Club is assisting the Division in the management of this area. **Except during permitted field trial and organized training events, the club does not maintain any exclusive use of the area and the area is open to all members of the public engaged in the act of retriever training.**
3. The Summit Retriever Training Area is closed to hunting except during the archery and firearm deer seasons (See Exception below).
4. No dog training is permitted during any firearm deer seasons, except on Sundays.
5. **Firearm deer hunting will not be permitted in the Summit Retriever Training Area during the Special October Antlerless Firearm Season** and as such dog training is permitted. Archery hunting will be permitted; archers must wear required hunter orange during any concurrent firearm deer season.
6. It is unlawful to enter the Summit Retriever Training Area for any purpose other than to train dogs in the act of retrieving or to hunt deer during the firearm or archery deer

seasons. It is unlawful to fish, operate model or full size boats, ride horses or bicycles, or conduct any other activity on the area.

OTHER SPORTING DOG TRAINING AREAS -

The Bowl Sporting Dog Area is located immediately west of the Summit Retriever Training Area, along the northside of the canal between Guthries Run and the Maryland State Line. The training of all sporting dogs is permitted within this area. Hunting and falconry is also permitted within this area.

MIKE CASTLE RECREATION TRAIL

1. Hunters may use the trail and parking areas to access the neighboring wildlife area lands, however, all firearms must be unloaded, including bolt removed from crossbow and cap/primer removed from muzzleloader, while on the trail or within any of the trail parking areas.
2. No person shall discharge any firearm while on or within 15 yards of the recreation trail or within any posted safety zone associated with the trail.
3. All dogs must be leashed while on the recreation trail or within any of the trail parking areas. Dog owners shall be responsible for cleanup and removal of any feces deposited by the animal.
4. Unauthorized motor vehicles prohibited on the recreation trail.
