





BLACKISTON WILDLIFE AREA

Persons may hunt on the Blackiston Wildlife Area only as directed by these rules, which have been established by Regulation 3908 of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103, 7 Delaware Code.

**Violators of wildlife area regulations may be subject to fines and/or revocation of their hunting privilege on state wildlife areas for up to one year.**

**Some areas may be closed to allow mentored hunting opportunities.**

**A. DOVE HUNTING**

Doves can be hunted on the entire wildlife area without a permit. **NO PERSON MAY TAKE DOVES ON STATE WILDLIFE AREAS DURING SEPTEMBER WHILE POSSESSING SHOT OTHER THAN APPROVED NON-TOXIC SHOT.**

**B. SMALL GAME** – Open in season except closed during the December and January shotgun deer seasons. Open for the January handgun and January muzzleloader deer seasons.

**C. DEER HUNTING** – THIS AREA WILL BE OPEN FOR ALL DEER SEASONS EXCEPT THE OCTOBER ANTLERLESS SEASONS. A HANDGUN MAY BE USED FOR DEER HUNTING IN PLACE OF A SHOTGUN DURING ANY SEASON WHEN A SHOTGUN IS A LEGAL WEAPON. Non-resident hunters are prohibited from driving deer on state wildlife areas. Each organized deer drive limited to 6 participants (Delaware resident hunters only). Deer hunting allowed from the ground, from a portable stand, or from a state-built stand. **No permanent non-state built deer stands are allowed and all parts of a portable stand must be removed at the end of each hunting day. No screw-in steps or stands allowed.**

**D. TURKEY HUNTING** - A valid Blackiston Wildlife Area turkey hunting permit is required.

**E. RACCOON HUNTING** – Raccoon hunting is allowed from September 1 until March 31 during legal raccoon hunting seasons.

**D. FOX AND COYOTE HUNTING** – Fox chasing allowed in season but prohibited until 1:00 P.M. during turkey hunting season. **Fox and coyote hunting allowed in season while hunting other game species per these map regulations.**

**E. WATERFOWL HUNTING** – Waterfowl hunting allowed in season. Hunters may take waterfowl by any legal means (jump shooting, etc). All waterfowl hunters are required to use non-toxic shot in all gauges. It is unlawful to possess lead shot while hunting waterfowl on the area. Special regulations will apply during the Snow Goose Conservation Order starting in early February.

**F. DOG TRAINING** – Rabbit dogs may be trained on Sundays during September, October, and November except for the Sunday during shotgun deer season.

**G. FISHING** – Fishing at Gleason pond is "catch and release" only.

**H. ALCOHOL** - Persons under the influence of alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs or possessing and/or consuming alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs shall not be permitted to hunt and/or possess firearms on Division lands.

**I. CARCASSES** – Disposal of dead animals or their parts on State Wildlife Areas is prohibited.

**STATE WILDLIFE AREA USE REGULATIONS**

**FIREARMS**

No firearms on Division lands from March 1 - August 31 except by permit during legal hunting seasons or authorized by the Division in writing. Target shooting is prohibited. The discharge or possession of paint guns on state wildlife areas is prohibited.

**HUNTING**

Permitted only as designated on area maps. No trapping except by valid contract holders. Call 284-4795 or 739-9912 for information.

**VEHICLES**

No off-highway vehicles, either registered or unregistered, permitted. Licensed motorized vehicles are only permitted on established and maintained roads.

**TRESPASS**

No entry into closed area or onto private land.

**HOURS**

Entry limited from sunrise to sunset except to lawfully hunt and fish.

**CAMPING/SWIMMING**

No unauthorized camping or swimming.


**DUMPING**

Dumping is strictly prohibited.

**HORSEBACK RIDING**

Horses may be used only on established roads open to vehicular traffic except for activities approved by the Division.



**TONY FLORIO WOODLAND BEACH WILDLIFE AREA  
DEER & UPLAND HUNTING**

Persons may hunt on the Tony Florio Woodland Beach Wildlife Area only as directed by these rules, which have been established by Regulation 3908 of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103.7 Delaware Code.

**Violators of wildlife area regulations may be subject to fines and/or revocation of their hunting privileges on state wildlife areas for up to one year. Failure to return harvest data cards will result in loss of hunting privileges, as accurate harvest data is vital to proper management of this area.**

**An Annual Stand/Blind Permit must be shown by each hunter prior to obtaining a daily hunting permit during all deer firearms and waterfowl seasons.**

**Some areas may be closed to allow mentored hunting opportunities.**

**BIG WOODS AND CABIN AREA**

**A. DEER – GENERAL**

**DEER HUNTING WILL NOT BE OPEN DURING THE SPECIAL OCTOBER ANTLERLESS FIREARMS SEASONS. THIS AREA IS A QUALITY BUCK AREA. ALL HUNTERS (EXCEPT THOSE UNDER 17 YEARS OLD AND NON-AMBULATORY) SHALL NOT TAKE ANTLERED DEER WITH AN OUTSIDE SPREAD OF LESS THAN 15 INCHES AT ANY TIME.**

1. Deer hunting during firearm seasons on this area will be by permit only. All deer hunters will check in at the Woodland Beach Checking Station before hunting. For the firearms seasons a daily lottery for stands will be held at **1 ½ hours** before legal shooting time and at 12:00 noon.
2. All permits must be returned to the checking station at the end of the days hunt. Failure to accurately report harvest and return permits will result in loss of hunting privileges.
3. No hunting on the refuge except as noted in D3.
4. All hunting will be from state-built deer stands only (as marked on map) except Archery (see B3)
5. Hand gun deer hunting will be allowed on some Woodland Beach tracts on Saturdays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays during the January handgun season. For details, check online at [www.dnrec.state.de.us/fw](http://www.dnrec.state.de.us/fw) or call the hunting check station at (302) 653-4802.

**B. DEER – ARCHERY & CROSSBOW**

1. Except for firearms seasons, archery & crossbow hunters must register for an archery zone at the tag board located at the checking station. Cabin area and Big Woods are separate zones. Hunters may hunt anywhere within the zone except the refuge and safety zones. During firearm seasons, hunters must register per lottery as per A (1-5).
2. Hunters must place tags on empty hooks when registering for zones and sign the registration sheet. If no empty hooks are available the zone is full. Hunters must remove tags when leaving the area. Zone availability is first come, first serve. **No one may register prior to 4:00 am the morning of the hunt.**
3. Except for firearms seasons, hunters may use state-built stands, hunt from the ground or portable stands. No permanent stands may be built and all parts of a portable stand must be removed at the end of the days hunt. No screw-in tree steps or stands allowed.

**C. DEER – MUZZLELOADER**

1. Deer hunting with muzzleloader during the 2 seasons will be open on all days by permit issued at the checking station.

**D. DEER - SHOTGUN**

1. A handgun may be used in place of a shotgun during any deer season when a shotgun is a legal weapon.
2. Deer hunting with shotgun will be open for stands 1-13, A & B on all days during November, December, and January seasons by permit only.
3. Hunting will be allowed from stands R1-R7 during the special youth hunt, on Monday and the second Friday during November shotgun season, Monday and Friday during December antlerless season, Tuesday and Thursday during January shotgun season, and Thursday during the muzzleloader seasons only.
4. **Special Youth Hunt.** Deer stands will be drawn by lottery at the Woodland Beach Checking station. A

lottery will be held **1 ½ hours** before legal shooting time and at **12:00 noon.**

5. **E. DEER - DISABLED HUNTERS** - Disabled hunting locations (HD1 & HD2) are available for non-ambulatory disabled hunters. The site will be closed on Youth Day, Monday and the second Friday of November shotgun season and Thursday during muzzleloader seasons. During the archery season, hunting at HD1 & HD2 on the refuge is restricted to 2 times per week per individual disabled hunter. Permits for these stands will be issued by a daily lottery conducted at the checking station at 11:00 AM the day prior to the hunt. Enter this lottery by calling the checking station at 653-4802. Deer stands 9-13 & R3 have been modified to accommodate less severe disabled hunters.

**F. UPLAND GAME, FOX, COYOTE, AND RACCOON HUNTING**

1. Upland game hunting (including falconry) at the Ennis and Goldsborough Tracts will be by permit only on Monday, Wednesday and Friday during January and February seasons only.
2. Permits will be issued by lottery at the Woodland Beach Checking Station at 8:00 am. Hunters must vacate the area by 3:30 pm daily
3. One party of up to 4 hunters will be given a permit at any one time. The party must remain within the boundary of their zone (see map).
4. Upland hunters may not take or attempt to take waterfowl. No hunting on the adjacent refuge or posted safety zones of residences.
5. State lands in the Cabin Area are open to upland hunting and raccoon hunting without a permit in season. Raccoon hunting is allowed in season.
6. **Fox chasing not allowed. Fox and coyote hunting allowed in season while hunting other game species per these map regulations.**

**G. TURKEY HUNTING** - Spring gobbler hunting allowed on entire area, including refuge, by permit only. (See Delaware Hunting and Trapping Guide for permit application.)

**H. DOG TRAINING - Not allowed on this tract.**

**I. FIREARMS** - Firearms are prohibited on State Wildlife Areas from March 1 through August 31 of each year except for special events authorized by the Division in writing. Target shooting is prohibited. Call Ommelanden Shooting Range for year-round target shooting information at (302) 323-5333.

**J. HORSEBACK RIDING** - Horses may be used only on established roads open to vehicular traffic except for activities approved by the Division.

**K. VEHICLES**- No off-highway vehicles, either registered or unregistered, permitted. Licensed motorized vehicles are only permitted on established and maintained roads.

**L. ALCOHOL** - Persons under the influence of alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs or possessing and/or consuming alcoholic beverages, liquors or drugs shall not be permitted to hunt and/or possess firearms on Division lands.




**Violators of wildlife area regulations may be subject to fines and/or revocation of their hunting privileges on state wildlife areas for up to one year. Failure to return harvest data cards may result in loss of hunting privileges, as accurate harvest data is vital to proper management of this area.**

**An Annual stand/blind permit must be shown by each hunter prior to obtaining a daily permit during all deer firearms and waterfowl seasons. Some areas may be closed to allow mentored hunting opportunities.**

**Some areas may be closed to allow mentored hunting opportunities.**

**A. WATERFOWL HUNTING REGULATIONS**

1. A state permit is required to hunt. The daily lottery will be held at the Woodland Beach Checking Station. All hunting from state-built pits and blinds only. (Locations on map).
2. Permits are issued from 1 ½ hours before legal shooting time until 1:00 pm
3. Failure to accurately report harvest and return permits to the checking station will result in loss of hunting privileges. A blank card will be interpreted as zero harvest.
4. No more than 3 persons shall occupy one pit or blind.
5. No waterfowl may be taken along the Lighthouse Road or in the Cabin Area.

**B. GOOSE PITS – SPECIAL REGULATIONS**

1. Designated goose pits will be opened for goose hunting on opening days, Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays during the regular waterfowl season. Pits may also be open during portions of the special snow goose season on various days and hours as posted at the checking station. The Division reserves the right to close the pits at any time to create refuge conditions for wintering Canada geese. To assure the area is open please call the Checking Station at (302) 653-4802.
2. Snow goose hunting permits will be issued via a daily lottery or by self sign-in for pits 40, 42, & 44. Special regulations will apply during the Snow Goose conservation Order starting in early February.
3. Hunting Hours: Legal shooting time until 2:00 pm. Hunters must vacate area by 3:00 pm.
4. Shell Limit 25
5. Parking: Park on areas at appropriate parking lots (see map).

**C. DUCK BLINDS -- SPECIAL REGULATIONS**

1. Hunters using duck blinds (1-27, A-D) must have boat and motor and required safety equipment to hunt.

2. Hunting Days: Monday through Saturday during the regular waterfowl season.
3. Hunting Hours: Legal shooting time until sunset. Hunters must vacate area by one hour after sunset.
4. No more the 3 persons shall occupy one blind.
5. Snow goose hunting permits will be issued via a daily lottery or by self sign-in for blinds.

**D. FIREARMS**

Firearms are prohibited on State Wildlife Areas from March 1 through August 31 of each year except for special events authorized by the Division in writing. Target shooting is prohibited.

**E. DOG TRAINING**

**Not allowed on this tract.**

**F. HORSEBACK RIDING**

Horses may be used only on established roads open to vehicular traffic except for activities approved by the Division.

**G. VEHICLES**

No off-highway vehicles, either registered or unregistered, permitted. Licensed motorized vehicles are only permitted on established and maintained roads.

**H. ALCOHOL**

Persons under the influence of alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs or possessing and/or consuming alcoholic beverages, liquors or drugs shall not be permitted to hunt and/or possess firearms on Division lands.



Persons may hunt on the Tony Florio Woodland Beach Wildlife Area – McKay Tract only as directed by the above rules, which have been established by Regulation 3908 of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103, 7 Delaware Code.

**Violators of wildlife area regulations may be subject to fines and/or revocation of their hunting privilege on state wildlife areas for up to one year. Failure to return harvest data cards will result in loss of hunting privileges, as accurate harvest data is vital to proper management of this area.**

**AN ANNUAL STAND/BLIND PERMIT MUST BE SHOWN BY EACH HUNTER PRIOR TO OBTAINING A DAILY HUNTING PERMIT DURING ALL DEER FIREARMS AND WATERFOWL SEASONS.**

**Some areas may be closed to allow mentored hunting opportunities.**

**A. DEER - GENERAL**

**DEER HUNTING WILL NOT BE OPEN DURING THE SPECIAL OCTOBER ANTLERLESS FIREARMS SEASONS.**

**THIS AREA IS A QUALITY BUCK AREA. ALL HUNTERS (EXCEPT THOSE UNDER 17 YEARS OLD AND NON-AMBULATORY) SHALL NOT TAKE ANTLERED DEER WITH AN OUTSIDE SPREAD OF LESS THAN 15 INCHES AT ANY TIME.**

1. Deer hunting during firearm seasons on the McKay Tract will be by permit only. All deer hunters will check in at the Woodland Beach Checking Station before hunting. For the muzzleloader and shotgun seasons a daily lottery for stands will be held at the checking station 1 1/2 hours before legal shooting time and at 12:00 Noon. Hunters are advised to arrive at least 15 minutes prior to the lottery.

2. All permits must be returned to the checking station at the end of the days hunt. All hunting from state-built deer stands only (as marked on map) except archery & crossbow (see B3).

**B. DEER – ARCHERY & CROSSBOW.**

1. Except for firearm seasons, archery & crossbow hunters on the McKay Tract must register for an archery zone at the tag board at the checking station. Hunters may hunt anywhere within the zone except the safety zones.

2. Hunters must place tags on empty hooks when registering for zones and sign the registration sheet. If no empty hooks are available, the zone is full. Hunters must remove tags when leaving the area. Zone availability is first come, first serve. No one must register prior to 4:00 AM the morning of the hunt.

3. Except for firearm seasons, hunters may use state-built stands, hunt from the ground or portable stands. All parts of a portable stand must be removed at the end of the days hunt. No permanent stands may be built. No nailed or screw-in tree steps allowed.

4. Archery hunting is closed during the Special Youth Hunt. During firearm seasons, hunters must register for lottery and hunt only from state-built stands.

**C. DEER - FIREARMS**

1. Deer hunting with muzzleloader and shotgun during the all seasons by permit will be open on all days except January when the area will be open Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays only.

2. A HANDGUN MAY BE USED IN PLACE OF A SHOTGUN DURING ANY DEER SHOTGUN SEASON WHEN A SHOTGUN IS A LEGAL WEAPON.

3. **SPECIAL YOUTH HUNT (NEW THIS YEAR)** deer stands will be drawn by lottery at Woodland Beach Checking Station 1-1/2 hours before legal shooting time and at 12:00 noon.

4. Hand gun deer hunting will be allowed on some Woodland Beach tracts on certain days during the January season. For details, check online at [www.dnrec.state.de.us/fw](http://www.dnrec.state.de.us/fw) during the fall hunting season or call the hunting check station at (302)653-4802.

**D. DEER - DISABLED** A blind for non-ambulatory (M24) is available. Permits for this stand will be issued via a daily lottery. The daily lottery for these stands will be conducted at 11:00 AM the day prior to hunt.

For additional information, call the Woodland Beach Checking Station at 653-4802.

Deer stands M2, M3, M7, and M8 have been modified to accommodate less severely disabled hunters.

**E. UPLAND GAME, RACCOON, FOX & COYOTE HUNTING**

1. Upland game hunting (including falconry) at the McKay Tract will be by permit only on Monday, Wednesday and Friday during November, December, January, and February seasons. No permit is required for September dove hunting on the McKay tract. **NO PERSON SHALL HUNT DOVES ON STATE WILDLIFE AREAS IN SEPTEMBER WHILE POSSESSING SHOT OTHER THAN APPROVED NON-TOXIC SHOT.**

2. Permits will be issued by lottery at the Woodland Beach Checking Station at 8:00 AM. Hunters must vacate the area by 3:30 PM daily.

3. Three parties of up to 4 hunters will be given a permit at any one time. Each party must remain within the boundary of their zone (see map). Upland hunters may not take or attempt to take waterfowl.

4. Small game hunting is prohibited during the December firearms deer season.

5. Raccoon hunting is open from September 1 until March 31 during legal raccoon hunting seasons.

6. Fox chasing NOT allowed. Fox and coyote hunting allowed in season while hunting other game..

7. Turkey hunting is allowed on entire area by permit only.

**F. WATERFOWL HUNTING**

1. A daily permit is required to hunt from Blinds H, I, and J,

2. Non-ambulatory disabled hunters will have priority over use of Blind J.

3. Hunters are advised to arrive at the Woodland Beach Checking Station at least 15 minutes prior to the time of lottery. Permits will be issued by a lottery at 1 1/2 hours before legal shooting time. Permits must be returned to the Checking Station at the end of the day's hunt.

4. No more than 3 persons shall occupy one blind.

5. Hunting Days: Opening days, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays. Blinds will not be re-issued.

6. Hunting Hours: Legal shooting time until 2:00 PM. Hunters must vacate area by 3:00 PM.

7. Parking: Park at appropriate parking lot (see map). Hunters must walk to the blinds. A gate key is available at the Checking Station for vehicle access for physically disabled or elderly.

NOTE: Waterfowl hunting may be closed during early or late snow goose season or during times of high Canada goose concentrations. Special snow goose season days and hours may vary. For info, please call the Checking Station at 653-4802. Special regulations will apply during the Snow Goose Conservation Order starting in early February.

**G. DOG TRAINING** – Rabbit dogs may be trained on Sundays during September, October, and November except for the Sunday during shotgun deer season.

**H. FISHING** – Fishing at the Berman Pond is strictly catch and release.



**A. WATERFOWL HUNTING REGULATIONS (BLINDS E, F, G) (BLIND K IS FOR DISABLED HUNTERS ONLY)**

1. A daily permit is required to hunt from Blinds E, F, and G. Non-ambulatory wheelchair-bound disabled hunters will have priority over the use of Blinds E & K.
2. Hunters are advised to arrive at the Woodland Beach Checking Station at least 15 minutes prior to the time of the lottery. A daily lottery will be held at 1 ½ hours before legal shooting time to determine which parties will be allowed to hunt.
3. Permits must be returned to the Checking Station at the end of the days hunt. A blank card will be interpreted as zero harvest.
4. No more than three persons shall occupy one blind
5. Hunting Days: Opening days, Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays. Blinds will not be reissued.
6. Hunting Hours: Legal shooting time until 10:00 am. Hunters must vacate the area by 11:00 am.
7. Parking: Park at appropriate parking lot (see map). Hunters must walk to the blinds. A gate key is available at the Checking Station for vehicle access for physically disabled or elderly hunters.
8. A boat and oars are provided at each blind. A PFD may be obtained from the Check Station attendant and returned at the end of the day's hunt.
9. Entry onto adjacent refuge is allowed only to retrieve crippled or dead birds.
10. Dogs must be in control at all times. No dogs are allowed in the adjacent refuge.

**NOTE:** Waterfowl hunting may be closed during early or late snow goose season or during times of high Canada goose concentrations. For information, please call the Woodland Beach Checking Station at (302) 653-4802. Special regulations will apply during the Snow Goose Conservation order starting in early February.

**B. DISABLED HUNTERS**

(See A-2) Permits for the disabled hunter blinds E & K will be issued via a daily lottery for unfilled blinds. The daily lottery for these blinds will be conducted at 11:00 am the day prior to the hunt. Enter lottery by calling the checking station at 653-4802. Priority will be given to non-ambulatory wheel chair bound hunters.

Deer stand R-9 has been modified to accommodate less severe handicapped hunters. For additional information call the Woodland Beach Check Station at (302) 653-4802 or Field office at (302) 284-4795.

**C. UPLAND & FOX & COYOTE HUNTING, DOG TRAINING**

The area is **closed** to upland game hunters. **Fox chasing not allowed. Fox and coyote hunting allowed in season while hunting other game species per these map regulations. Dog training is not allowed on this tract.**

**D. DEER HUNTING**

**DEER HUNTING WILL NOT BE OPEN DURING THE SPECIAL OCTOBER ANTLERLESS FIREARMS SEASONS. THIS AREA IS NOW A QUALITY BUCK AREA. ALL HUNTERS (EXCEPT THOSE UNDER 17 YEARS OLD AND NON-AMBULATORY) SHALL NOT TAKE ANTLERED DEER**

**WITH AN OUTSIDE SPREAD OF LESS THAN 15 INCHES AT ANY TIME.**

1. Deer hunting by permit will be allowed from Stands R8-R10 during the special youth hunt, on Monday and the second Friday during November shotgun season. Monday and Friday during December antlerless season, Tuesday and Thursday during January shotgun season and Thursday during muzzleloader seasons only. These stands will be issued by a daily lottery. A lottery will be held at the Woodland Beach Checking Station 1 ½ hours before legal shooting time and at 12:00 noon. For information consult your Delaware Hunting & Trapping Guide.
2. Hunters are advised to arrive at least 15 minutes prior to the lottery.
3. **SPECIAL YOUTH DEER (NEW THIS YEAR)** stands will be drawn by a lottery at Woodland Beach Checking Station. A lottery for stands will be held at 1 ½ hours before legal shooting time and at 12:00 noon.
4. A handgun may be used in place of a shotgun during any deer season when a shotgun is the legal weapon. Handgun deer hunting will be allowed on some Woodland Beach tracts on certain days during the January season. For details, check online at [www.dnrec.state.de.us/fw](http://www.dnrec.state.de.us/fw) during the fall hunting seasons or call the hunting check station at (302) 653-4802.

**E. TURKEY HUNTING**

Spring gobbler hunting allowed on entire area, including the refuge, by permit only

**F. FIREARMS**

Firearms are prohibited on State Wildlife Areas from March 1 through August 31 of each year except for special events authorized by the Division in writing. Target shooting is prohibited. The discharge or possessions of paintball guns are prohibited.

**G. HORSEBACK RIDING**

Horses may be used on established roads open to vehicular traffic except for activities approved by the Division.

**H. VEHICLES**

No off-highway vehicles, either registered or unregistered, permitted. Licensed motorized vehicles are only permitted on established and maintained roads.

**I. FISHING**

Fishing in Edna's Pond and the ponds across from AREC is strictly catch and release.

**J. ALCOHOL**

Persons under the influence of alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs or possessing and/or consuming alcoholic beverages, liquors or drugs shall not be permitted to hunt and/or possess firearms on Division lands.

A. SMALL GAME HUNTING

Small game hunting (including falconry) allowed in season on a non-permit basis. Closed during December and January deer seasons. Open for the handgun and January muzzleloader season. NO PERSON SHALL HUNT DOVES ON STATE WILDLIFE AREAS IN SEPTEMBER WHILE POSSESSING SHOT OTHER THAN APPROVED NON-TOXIC SHOT.

The daily lottery for this blind will be conducted at 11:00 AM the day prior to the hunt. For additional information, call the Woodland Beach Checking Station at 653-4802. Special regulations will apply during the Snow Goose Conservation Order starting in early February.

B. DEER HUNTING

This area will be open for all deer seasons including the special October firearms antlerless seasons and the January handgun deer season on a non-permit basis. Hunters may hunt from a stand or from the ground. A handgun may be used for deer hunting in place of a shotgun during any season when a shotgun is a legal weapon. No permanent non-state built deer stands are allowed and all parts of a portable stand must be removed at the end each hunting day.

F. DOG TRAINING – Rabbit dogs may be trained on Sundays during September, October, and November except for the Sunday during shotgun deer season.

G. FISHING - Fishing at Edna's Pond is "catch and release" only.

H. FIREARMS

Firearms are prohibited on state wildlife areas from March 1 – August 31 except by permit during legal hunting seasons or as authorized by the Division of Fish and Wildlife in writing. Target shooting is prohibited. The discharge or possession of paintball guns is prohibited.

C. TURKEY HUNTING

Turkey hunting is allowed on entire area by permit (See Delaware Hunting and Fishing Guide for permit application)

I. HORSEBACK RIDING

Horses may be used only on established roads open to vehicular traffic except for activities approved by the Division.

D. RACCOON, FOX & COYOTE HUNTING

Raccoon hunting open from September 1 until March 31 during legal raccoon hunting season. Fox chasing in season allowed except prohibited until 1:00 P.M. during turkey season. Fox and coyote hunting allowed in season while hunting other game species per these map regulations.

J. VEHICLES

No off-highway vehicles, either registered or unregistered, permitted. Licensed motorized vehicles are only permitted on established and maintained roads.

E. WATERFOWL HUNTING (DISABLED HUNTERS ONLY)

Waterfowl hunting is not permitted on the Lighthouse Island Tract except for disabled hunters at Blind K by permit. (at Edna's Pond) Non-ambulatory disabled hunters will have priority over the use of Blind K. Permits for this blind are issued by a daily lottery. Hunting days: Daily. Hunting hours: Legal shooting time until 2:00 P.M.

K. ALCOHOL

Persons under the influence of alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs or possessing and/or consuming alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs shall not be permitted to hunt and/or possess firearms on Division lands.

L. CARCASSES – Disposal of dead animals or their parts on State Wildlife Areas is prohibited.



**A STAND/BLIND PERMIT MUST BE SHOWN BY EACH HUNTER PRIOR TO OBTAINING A DAILY HUNTING PERMIT DURING ALL DEER FIREARMS AND WATERFOWL SEASONS.**

**Some areas may be closed to allow mentored hunting opportunities.**

**A. DEER – FIREARMS**

1. **Deer Hunting will not be open for the Special October Antlerless Firearms Season.** Deer hunting will be **open all days during all other firearms deer seasons except January shotgun and January handgun season** when the area will be open on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays only.
2. A handgun may be used in place of a shotgun for deer hunting during any deer season when a shotgun is the legal weapon.
3. All hunters must check in at the **Little Creek Checking Station** prior to hunting. For the muzzleloader and shotgun seasons, daily lotteries will be held 1 ½ hours before legal shooting time and at 12:00 noon. Hunters are advised to arrive at least 15 minutes prior to the lottery.
4. All permits **MUST** be returned to the Checking Station at the end of the days hunt. **FAILURE TO ACCURATELY REPORT HARVEST AND RETURN PERMITS WILL RESULT IN LOSS OF HUNTING PRIVILEGES.** A blank card will be interpreted as zero (0) harvest.
5. Deer hunters will park in the appropriate parking lot (see map) and go directly to their stands.
6. Hunters may not drive deer and must hunt from state-built deer stands.

**B. DEER – ARCHERY & CROSSBOW**

1. Archery and crossbow hunters must register at the tag board located at the parking lot. **No one must register prior to 4:00 am the morning of the hunt.**
2. Hunters must place tags on empty hooks when registering and sign the registration sheet. If no empty hooks are available, the zone is full. Hunters must remove tags when leaving the area.
3. Hunters may use state-built stands, portable stands or hunt from the ground. Archers may hunt anywhere within the tract except the safety zone. No permanent stands may be built and all parts of portable stands must be removed at the end of the days hunt. No screw-in tree steps allowed. Stand availability is first-come, first-serve.
4. Archery & crossbow hunting allowed Monday – Saturday during the archery season. Hunters must obtain permits through the daily lottery during the firearms deer seasons. (See Section A.3) Archery & crossbow hunting is closed during the Special Youth Deer Hunt.
5. Archery & crossbow hunters must abide by rules of firearm hunters when hunting during firearms seasons.

**C. DEER – DISABLED HUNTERS**

Deer hunting location HDT is available for non-ambulatory hunters. See the Delaware Hunting & Trapping Guide. All other deer stands have been modified to accommodate less severely disabled hunters.

**D. SMALL GAME, FALCONRY, FOX, COYOTE, AND TURKEY HUNTING**

1. Upland game (gray squirrel, rabbit, pheasant, quail, dove, woodcock, snipe, and crows) hunting (including

falconry) will be allowed during the appropriate firearms seasons by permit only on Monday, Wednesdays and Fridays during November, December, January and February. Upland game hunting is closed during December Antlerless Deer Season.

2. Permits will be issued by lottery at **8:00 am at the Little Creek Checking Station.** Hunters must vacate area by 3:30 pm daily.
3. One party, of up to four (4) hunters, will be given a permit at any one time. Upland hunters may not take or attempt to take waterfowl.
4. **Fox hunting allowed in season while hunting other game species per these map regulations.**
5. **Turkey hunting** is allowed with a valid Little Creek Wildlife Area turkey permit.

**E. WATERFOWL – DISABLED HUNTERS**

1. Permits for the disabled hunter (Blind T) will be issued by lottery. The daily lottery for this blind will be conducted at 11:00 am the day prior to the hunt. **For additional information, call the Little Creek Checking Station (739-4610).**
2. Hunting days: Opening days, Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday during duck Season. The blind may be open during certain parts of the snow goose season. Hunters are advised to contact the Little Creek Checking Station to find out when the blind is open. The Division reserves the right to close the blind at any time to create refuge conditions for wintering Canada geese. This blind will not be open during any firearm deer season. Special regulations will apply during the Snow Goose Conservation order starting in early February.

**F. DOG TRAINING –**

Rabbit dogs may be trained on Sundays during September, October, and November except for the Sunday during shotgun deer season.

**FIREARMS REGULATIONS** - No firearms on Division lands from March 1 - August 31 except by permit during legal hunting seasons or authorized by the Division of Fish and Wildlife. The discharge or possession of paintball guns is prohibited.

**VEHICLE REGULATIONS** -.No off-highway vehicles, either registered or unregistered, permitted. Licensed motorized vehicles are only permitted on established and maintained roads.

**ALCOHOL**- Persons under the influence of alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs or possessing and/or consuming alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs shall not be permitted to hunt and/or possess firearms on Division lands.



**Violators of wildlife area regulations may be subject to fines and/or revocation of their hunting privilege on state wildlife areas for up to one year. All National Wildlife Refuge regulations apply to the Davey Crockett Area)**

**FIREARMS DEER HUNTING BY PERMIT ONLY. AN ANNUAL STAND/BLIND PERMIT MUST BE SHOWN BY EACH HUNTER PRIOR TO OBTAINING A DAILY PERMIT DURING ALL DEER FIREARMS AND SEASONS (except for deer stands 11-23). FIREARMS DEER HUNTING RESTRICTED TO HUNTING FROM STATE BUILT STANDS ONLY. DRIVING OR PUSHING OF DEER IS PROHIBITED. **A. DEER - GENERAL**

FIREARMS DEER HUNTING WILL NOT BE OPEN DURING THE SPECIAL OCTOBER ANTLERLESS FIREARMS SEASONS.

1. Deer hunting during firearm seasons on the Davey Crockett Tract will be by permit only. All deer hunters will check in at the Little Creek Checking Station before hunting.
2. For the muzzleloader and shotgun seasons a daily lottery will be held at the checking station 1 1/2 hours before legal shooting time and at 12:00 Noon. Hunters are advised to arrive at least 15 minutes prior to the lottery.
3. All permits must be returned to the checking station at the end of the days hunt. All hunting from state-built deer stands only (as marked on map) except archery (see B3).
4. Deer stand 1 has been modified to accommodate ambulatory disabled hunters.

**B. DEER – ARCHERY & CROSSBOW.**

1. Except for firearms seasons, hunters on the Davey Crockett Tract must register for a zone at the tagboard at the parking lots. Hunters may hunt anywhere within the zone except the safety zones.
2. Hunters must place tags on empty hooks when registering for zones and sign the registration sheet. If no empty hooks are available, the zone is full. Hunters must remove tags when leaving the area. Zone availability is first come, first serve.
3. Except for firearms seasons, hunters may use state-built stands, hunt from the ground or portable stands. No permanent stands may be built and all parts of a portable stand must be removed by the end of the days hunt. No nailed or screw-in tree steps allowed.
4. Archery hunting is closed during the Special Youth Hunt. During firearms seasons, hunters must register for lottery and hunt only from state-built stands.

**C. DEER - FIREARMS**

Deer hunting with muzzleloader and shotgun during the all seasons (including Special Youth Hunt) by permit will be open on all days. Permits will be issued at the Little Creek checking station. (See A2) A handgun may be used in place of a shotgun for deer hunting during shotgun season when a shotgun is a legal weapon. Closed during January handgun season.

**D. UPLAND GAME HUNTING**

1. Hunters may take small game in season. Use care to stay on state and federal lands - do not trespass onto private lands. Small game hunting closed during the December and January shotgun deer seasons. This area has fields planted with grain or sunflowers that are mowed prior to the season to attract doves. These areas are marked with a "D" on the front of the map. Pre-season scouting is advised. Dove hunting will be permitted only on Opening day, Labor Day, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays during September from 1:00 – 5:00 pm. A lottery for the permits will be held at 12:00 Noon on the above days at the Little Creek Checking Station on Route 9. Dove hunting on this tract by permit only during September.

Dove hunting allowed on the entire tract after September on a non-permit basis. **NO PERSON SHALL HUNT DOVES ON STATE WILDLIFE AREAS IN SEPTEMBER WHILE POSSESSING SHOT OTHER THAN APPROVED NON-TOXIC SHOT. NO PERSON SHALL HUNT SMALL GAME ON BOMBAY HOOK NWR WHILE POSSESSING SHOT OTHER THAN APPROVED NON-TOXIC SHOT.**

2. Upland hunters may not take or attempt to take waterfowl.
3. For Bombay Hook NWR property, small game hunting includes only legal take of gray squirrel, cottontail rabbit, Ring-necked Pheasant, Bobwhite Quail, raccoon, opossum, red fox, and Mourning Dove.
4. Hunting within the safety zone of residences is prohibited. This law will be strictly enforced.
5. Raccoon hunting is open from September 1 until March 31 during legal raccoon hunting seasons.
6. Turkey hunting is allowed on entire area with a Little Creek Wildlife Area permit only.
7. **FOX AND COYOTE HUNTING** – Fox chasing allowed in season but is prohibited until 1:00 P.M. during turkey hunting season. Fox hunting allowed in season while hunting other game species per these map regulations. Coyote hunting allowed in season while hunting other game species but is not allowed on Bombay Hook property (Zone 2).
8. **DOG TRAINING** – Rabbit dogs may be trained on state owned property on Sundays during September, October, and November except for the Sunday during shotgun deer season. Dog training on Bombay Hook NWR property is prohibited.

**E. WATERFOWL HUNTING**

Hunters may take waterfowl by any legal means (jump shooting etc). Waterfowl hunting is permitted in the agricultural fields in season except during firearms deer seasons. Special regulations will apply during the Snow Goose Conservation Order starting in early February.

**F. FIREARMS**

No firearms on Division lands from March 1 - August 31 except by permit during legal hunting seasons or Authorized by the Division of Fish and Wildlife. Target shooting or practice shooting is prohibited. Discharge or possession of paintball guns is prohibited. Call Ommelanden Shooting Range for year-round target shooting information at 323-5333.

**G. HORSEBACK RIDING**

Horses may be used only on established state-owned roads open to vehicular traffic.

**H. VEHICLES**

No off-highway vehicles, either registered or unregistered, permitted. Licensed motorized vehicles are only permitted on established and maintained roads.

**I. ALCOHOL**

Persons under the influence of alcohol beverages, liquors, or drugs or possessing and/or consuming alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs shall not be permitted to hunt and/or possess firearms on Division lands.

Persons may hunt on the Little Creek Wildlife Area only as directed by these rules, which have been established by Regulation 3908 of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103, 7 Delaware Code.

**Violators of wildlife area regulations may be subject to fines and/or revocation of their hunting privileges on state wildlife areas for up to one year. Failure to return harvest data cards will result in loss of hunting privileges, as accurate harvest data is vital to proper management of this area**

**AN ANNUAL STAND/BLIND PERMIT MUST BE SHOWN BY EACH HUNTER PRIOR TO OBTAINING A DAILY HUNTING PERMIT DURING THE WATERFOWL SEASONS.**

**Some areas may be closed to allow mentored hunting opportunities.**

**A. WATERFOWL HUNTING REGULATIONS (BLINDS 1-15)**

1. Hunting days and hunt times for this area are as follows: **Opening Days of Each Split in Season Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturdays, Special Youth Day, Holidays (Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving, Christmas, New Year's Day) Legal Shooting time until Sunset.**  
**Note:** This area will not be open for the September Teal Season. Also waterfowl hunting may be closed during early or late Snow Goose Season. To assure area is open please call the **Check Station at (302) 739-4610.**
2. A state permit is required to hunt these blinds. Hunters must obtain this permit at the Little Creek Check Station. A daily drawing is held **2 hours before legal shooting time.** Vacated blinds will be re-issued until 1:00 P.M. Permits must be returned to the check station upon completion of the days hunt. Failure to report harvest or to turn in permits will result in loss of area hunting privileges. A blank card will be interpreted as zero (0) harvest.
3. All hunting will be from state-built blinds only (Blind locations shown on map) except waterfowl hunting by any legal means (jump shooting etc.) allowed south of Pickering Beach Road.
4. All hunters must have a boat and required safety equipment to hunt. No boats will be allowed at access ramps or in the impoundments without a waterfowl permit. No air boats are to be used.
5. No more than three (3) persons in a hunting party shall occupy one blind.
6. Non-Ambulatory handicapped hunters will have priority for the use of Blind 7. Permits for handicapped blind will be issued by a daily lottery. The daily lottery for handicapped blind 7 will be conducted at the Little Creek Check Station at 11:00 a.m. the day prior to the day of the hunt. For additional information please call the check station at the number above.
7. Hunting will be permitted in agricultural fields A1-A3 during December and January on days and times listed above for blinds. No blinds will be provided and hunters must remove temporary blinds after each hunt. No more than 3 persons per hunting party.

**SNOW GOOSE ONLY SEASON**

The Little Creek Wildlife Area will be open for snow goose hunting only when sufficient numbers of snow geese are present. Please call the check station for daily hunt information. The following rules apply to hunting snow geese on this area:

1. No more than three (3) persons will be allowed per party. A total of six parties will be assigned to Unit I and a total of eight parties to Unit II.
2. Permits are issued either by lottery 2 hours before legal shooting time if the check station is open or by a self-sign-in if the check station is not open.
3. Hunting hours – Legal shooting time until sunset.
4. Hunting will be allowed within the impounded areas of both Units including blinds, open water, mudflat and salt marsh vegetation and fields A1-A3. Hunting will not be allowed within posted refuge area or from the dikes.
5. Cutting of grass, shrubs or other vegetation for blinds or any other purpose is prohibited.
6. All temporary blinds, decoys and decoy material must be removed after each hunt including paper or plastic

containers, or any other materials used to attract snow geese.

7. All persons in each hunting party (maximum of 3) must hunt from the same blind or location within assigned unit.
  8. Persons may hunt on Little Creek Wildlife Area only as directed by the above rules during Special Snow Goose Season. **THESE RULES DO NOT APPLY DURING THE REGULAR WATERFOWL SEASON.**
  9. Special regulations will apply during the Snow Goose Conservation order starting in early February.
- B. UPLAND HUNTING, RACCOON, DEER, FOX, COYOTE, TURKEY HUNTING, DOG TRAINING AND CRABBING REGULATIONS.**
1. Upland hunters will not take or attempt to take waterfowl.
  2. **NO PERSON SHALL HUNT DOVES ON STATE WILDLIFE AREAS IN SEPTEMBER WHILE POSSESSING SHOT OTHER THAN APPROVED NON-TOXIC SHOT.**
  3. Upland game may be taken in season. Small game hunting is closed during the December and January shotgun deer seasons but open during the January handgun and muzzleloader seasons.
  4. This area is open for spring turkey hunting by permit only. Raccoon hunting (kill and chase) is open from September 1 until March 31 during legal raccoon hunting seasons.
  5. **Fox AND coyote hunting allowed in season while hunting other game species per these map regulations.**
  6. Crabbing is not allowed in the Port Mahon impoundment.
  7. No permanent non-state built deer stands are allowed and all parts of a portable stand must be removed at the end of the hunting day. No screw-in steps or stands allowed.
  8. **DOG TRAINING** – Rabbit dogs may be trained on Sundays during September, October, and November except for the Sunday during shotgun deer season.

**C. FIREARMS**

No firearms on Division lands from March 1 – August 31 except by permit during legal hunting seasons or authorized by the Division of Fish and Wildlife. Call Ommelanden Shooting Range for year-round shooting information at (302)323-5333. The discharge or possession of paintball guns is prohibited.

**D. VEHICLES**

No off-highway vehicles, either registered or unregistered, permitted. Licensed motorized vehicles are only permitted on established and maintained roads.

**E. ALCOHOL**

Persons under the influence of alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs or possessing and/or consuming alcoholic beverages, liquors or drugs shall not be permitted to hunt and/or possess firearms on Division lands.

**Some areas may be closed to allow mentored hunting opportunities.**

- A. DEER HUNTING** – Deer hunting on this tract is restricted to archery, crossbow or special mentored hunts as organized by the Division of Fish and Wildlife (youth or disabled). Archery and crossbow equipment may be used during all firearm deer seasons provided hunter orange requirement is met.
- B. FOX & COYOTE HUNTING** - Fox and coyote hunting allowed in season while hunting other game species per these map regulations.
- C. TURKEY HUNTING** - A valid Urban & Fortney Tract turkey hunting permit is required. The drawing for permits is held in early December. See the Hunting and Trapping Guide or call 284-4795 for more information.
- D. DOG TRAINING** – Rabbit dogs may be trained on Sundays during September, October, and November except for the Sunday during shotgun deer season.
- E. NO SMALL GAME, WATERFOWL, RACCOON, OR FIREARMS DEER HUNTING (except as mentioned above) ALLOWED ON THIS TRACT.**
- F. DEER STANDS** – No permanent non-state built deer stands are allowed and all parts of a portable stand must be removed at the end of each hunting day. No screw-in tree stands or steps may be used.
- D. ALCOHOL** - Persons under the influence of alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs or possessing and/or consuming alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs shall not be permitted to hunt and/or possess firearms on Division lands.
- E. CARCASSES** – Disposal of dead animals or their parts on State Wildlife Areas is prohibited.

**STATE WILDLIFE AREA USE REGULATIONS  
FIREARMS**

No firearms on Division lands from March 1 - August 31 except by permit during legal hunting seasons or authorized by the Division in writing. Target shooting is prohibited. The discharge or possession of paintball guns on state wildlife areas is prohibited.

**HUNTING**

Permitted only as designated on area maps. No trapping except by valid contract holders. Call 284-4795 or 739-9912 for information.

**VEHICLES**

No off-highway vehicles, either registered or unregistered, permitted. Licensed motorized vehicles are only permitted on established and maintained roads.

**TRESPASS**

No entry into closed area or onto private land.

**HOURS**

Entry limited from sunrise to sunset except to lawfully hunt and fish.

**CAMPING/SWIMMING**

No unauthorized camping or swimming.

**DUMPING**

Dumping is strictly prohibited.

**HORSEBACK RIDING**

Horses may be used only on established roads open to vehicular traffic except for activities approved by the Division.



**Violators of wildlife area regulations may be subject to fines and/or revocation of their hunting privileges on state wildlife areas for up to one year. Failure to return harvest data card will result in loss of hunting privileges, as accurate harvest data is vital to proper management of this area.**

**A STAND/BLIND PERMIT MUST BE SHOWN BY EACH HUNTER PRIOR TO OBTAINING A DAILY HUNTING PERMIT DURING ALL DEER FIREARMS AND WATERFOWL SEASONS.**

**Some areas may be closed to allow mentored hunting opportunities.**

**A. DEER - GENERAL**

1. **Deer Hunting will not be open during the Special October Antlerless Firearm Seasons.**
2. A daily permit is required to hunt deer (except archery hunters – See Deer Archery).
3. All firearms deer hunters must check in at the **Little Creek Checking Station** prior to hunting. For the Muzzleloader and Shotgun seasons a daily lottery for stands will be held **1 ½ hours** before legal shooting time. **Hunters** should arrive at check station **prior to 15 minutes** before the daily lottery. Stands vacated by hunters leaving early or were not issued prior will be issued by a second lottery at **12:00 noon**.
4. All permits **MUST** be returned to the checking station at the end of the days hunt. A blank card will be interpreted as zero (0) harvest.
5. Hunters will park in the appropriate parking lot (see map) and go directly to their stands.
6. Hunters may not drive deer and must hunt from state-built stands during firearms deer seasons.
7. No hunting is permitted in refuge area except as outlined below in section D.
8. **Stands A1 and A2 are for archery & crossbow hunting only. (No Muzzleloaders or Shotguns)**
9. A handgun may be used in place of a shotgun for deer hunting during any shotgun season when a shotgun is the legal weapon. Handgun deer hunting will be allowed on some Ted Harvey tracts and stands on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays during the January season. For details, check online at [www.dnrec.state.de.us/fw](http://www.dnrec.state.de.us/fw) or call the **Little Creek Check Station at (302) 739-4610**

**B. DEER – ARCHERY & CROSSBOW**

1. Archery & crossbow hunters must register for a zone at the tagboard located across from the information board. Zones are the same as used for upland hunting (see map). Hunters may hunt anywhere within the zone except the refuge, safety zones and dikes.
2. Hunters must place tags on empty hooks when registering for zones and sign the registration sheet. If no empty hooks are available, the zone is full. Hunters must remove tags when leaving the area. Zone availability is first-come, first-serve. **No one may register prior to 4:00 A.M. the morning of the hunt.**
3. Hunters may use state-built stands, hunt from the ground or portable stands. No permanent stands may be built and all parts of a portable stand must be removed at the end of the days hunt. No screw-in tree steps are allowed.
4. During any firearm deer season stands will be issued through the Little Creek Check Station.
5. Stands A1 and A2 will be open during the muzzleloader and shotgun seasons for archery & crossbow hunting only. The stands will be issued through the daily lottery and archers will be required to wear hunter orange clothing.

**C. DEER – MUZZLELOADER**

1. Deer hunting with muzzleloader will be open all days of the October and January seasons by permit only. **Upland game hunting will be occurring concurrently during the January season.**
2. Hunting from **Refuge Stands R1 – R6** will be permitted on the Wednesday of each muzzleloader season by daily lottery.

**D. DEER – SHOTGUN**

1. Deer hunting with shotgun will be **OPEN all days of the November Season, Monday, Wednesday and Friday of the December Antlerless Season, and Tuesday, Thursday, and Saturday of the January Season** by permit only. Limited number of stands will be open during Youth Deer Hunt and Saturdays of December Antlerless season.

2. Hunting from Refuge Stands R1-R6 will be permitted the Monday and second Friday of the November Shotgun season, Monday and Friday of the December Antlerless season, Tuesday and Thursday of the January Shotgun season and during the Youth Deer Hunt.

**E. DEER – DISABLED HUNTERS** - Disabled hunting locations (HDA, HDB, & HDC) are available for non-ambulatory disabled hunters. HDA & HDC will be closed on Youth Day, Monday and the second Friday of November shotgun season and Thursday during muzzleloader seasons. During the archery season, hunting at HDA & HDC on the refuge is restricted to 2 times per week per individual disabled hunter. Permits for these stands during firearms seasons will be issued by a daily lottery conducted at the checking station at 11:00 AM the day prior to the hunt. Enter this lottery by calling the checking station at 739-4610. Deer stands 5,7,9,10,11,& 14 have been modified to accommodate less severely disabled hunters. HDC open Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays during archery season and closed when stands R1-R6 open.

**F. UPLAND HUNTING, FOX, COYOTE & TURKEY HUNTING, DOG TRAINING**

1. Upland game (gray squirrel, rabbit, pheasant, quail, dove, woodcock, snipe, and crows) hunting will be allowed in season by permit **Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays** during November, December, January, & February **EXCEPT -Closed Antlerless Deer Season.**
2. Permits will be issued by lottery at **8:00 am at the Little Creek Check Station**. Hunters must vacate the area by 3:30 pm daily.
3. Two parties, of up to 4 hunters each, will be given permits at any one time. Upland hunters may not take or attempt to take waterfowl.
4. Hunters or their dogs may not enter the refuge for any reason.
5. No raccoon hunting or chasing. Fox chasing is not permitted.
6. Turkey hunting on entire area, including the refuge is permitted with a valid Ted Harvey Turkey Hunting Permit.
7. **Fox and coyote hunting allowed in season while hunting other game species per these map regulations.**
8. **Dog training not allowed on this area.**

**G. DOVE HUNTING**

1. This area has fields planted with grain or sunflowers and mowed prior to the dove season to attract doves. Pre-season scouting is advised. Fields are marked with a "D" on the front of the map. **NO PERSON SHALL HUNT DOVES ON STATE WILDLIFE AREAS IN SEPTEMBER WHILE POSSESSING SHOT OTHER THAN APPROVED NON-TOXIC SHOT.**
2. Dove hunting will be from **1:00 pm – 5:00 pm on Opening Day, Labor Day, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays in September** by permit only. A drawing will be held at **12:00 pm** to issue permits at the **Little Creek Checking Station**. No dove hunting after September except as noted in F 1 above.

**H. HORSEBACK RIDING** – Horseback riding is not permitted on this tract.

**I. FISHING** – Fishing in the Disabled Fishing Pond is for disabled anglers only and is strictly catch and release.

**J. VEHICLES** – No off-highway vehicles, either registered or unregistered, permitted. Licensed motorized vehicles are only permitted on established and maintained roads.

**K. ALCOHOL** - - Persons under the influence of alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs or possessing and/or consuming alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs shall not be permitted to hunt and/or possess firearms on Division lands.



Failure to return harvest data cards may result in loss of hunting privileges, as accurate harvest data is vital to proper management of this area**

**A STAND/BLIND PERMIT MUST BE SHOWN BY EACH HUNTER PRIOR TO OBTAINING A DAILY HUNTING PERMIT DURING ALL DEER FIREARMS AND WATERFOWL SEASONS.**

**Some areas may be closed to allow mentored hunting opportunities.**

**A. GENERAL WATERFOWL HUNTING REGULATIONS - Hunters are responsible for knowing all Regulations.**

1. A permit issued from the Little Creek Check Station is required to hunt this area. A daily lottery will be held two (2) hours before legal shooting to issue permits. Following the initial drawing **ONLY** Blinds 32 – 44 (River and Roberts Island Duck Blinds) can be reissued by a waiting list until 1:00 PM each day.
2. All hunting must be from State-built pits and blinds only (Blind locations shown on map).
3. **Hunt days and Hours: Blinds 16 – 31** (Ted Harvey Goose Pits and Duck Blinds) – **Opening days (during each split in season), and Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays** of the duck season from **Legal Shooting Time – 2:00 pm** Hunters must vacate area by 3:00 pm. **Blinds 23 - 31** (Ted Harvey Duck Blinds) **will also be open during the same hours on Holidays even if the holiday falls on a day when they are not usually open. These Blinds will be open during the same hours for Youth Waterfowl Hunt. Blinds 32-37** (River Blinds) and **38-44** (Roberts Island) will be **open every day** of the duck season from **Legal Shooting time until sunset**. Hunters must vacate the area by one hour after sunset.  
**\*\*NOTE: Blinds 23 - 25 & 27 – 31 WILL NOT BE OPEN during September Teal Season. Blind 26 will only be available to NON-AMBULATORY hunters during that time.**
4. A blind **(26)** is available for non-ambulatory handicapped hunters. Permits for the handicapped blind will be issued by a daily lottery. The daily lottery for the handicapped blind will be conducted at 11:00 am the day prior to the hunt. For additional information, call the Little Creek Check Station at (302) 739-4610. For opening day reservations, call 284-4795 at least 1 week prior to the season.
5. Permits must be returned to the checking station at the end of the days hunt. A blank permit will be interpreted as zero (0) harvest.
6. No boats are allowed at access ramps or in impoundments without a valid waterfowl permit.
7. Water blinds will be open during certain parts of the snow goose season. Hunters are advised to contact the Little Creek Station to find out what blinds are available.

**B. GOOSE PITS – SPECIAL REGULATIONS**

1. Pits and field blinds will be issued by daily lottery at the Little Creek Check Station. Hunters should be at the Check Station at least 15 minutes prior to daily lottery or their blind will be issued during that lottery. Goose pits will be open during the duck season as described in Section A above and will also be open during certain parts of the Snow Goose season. Hunters are advised to contact the Little Creek Check Station to find out when pits are available. The Division reserves the right to close the pits at any time to create refuge conditions for wintering Canada geese.
2. No more the three (3) persons shall occupy one blind or pit.
3. Parking: Park on area at appropriate parking lots (see map).

**C. DUCK BLINDS - SPECIAL REGULATIONS**

1. Access to duck blinds (23-25 & 27-44) requires a boat with the proper safety equipment to hunt. See Delaware Hunting and Trapping Guide.
2. No more the three (3) persons shall occupy one blind.
3. Shell Limit: There is no limit – but do not sky bust.
4. Airboats are not permitted.

**D. LATE SNOW GOOSE HUNTING – SPECIAL REGULATION**

1. Snow goose hunting will be permitted from late January – March provided sufficient numbers of geese are present. Please call the Checking Station for updates.
2. A permit will be required to hunt. Permits issued by lottery (as described in “A” above), or self sign-in if checking station is closed.
3. Two parties of up to three (3) hunters will be allowed in each section of the impoundment. Hunters may use the state-built blinds or set up anywhere within the impoundment **EXCEPT** the posted refuge area and dikes. River blinds and field pits will also be available.
4. Hours for hunting will be ½ hour before sunrise until sunset during all legal late snow goose season days.
5. All persons in each party (maximum of 3) must hut from the same location.
6. Temporary blinds are permitted in the impoundment but must be removed after each hunt.
7. The Division reserves the right to close the area to hunting to create refuge conditions
8. Special regulations will apply during the Snow Goose Conservation Order starting in early February.

**E. NON – TOXIC SHOT**

All waterfowl hunters are required to use non-toxic shot in all gauges. It is unlawful to possess lead shot while hunting waterfowl.

**F. DOG TRAINING Not allowed on this tract.**

**G. FOX HUNTING - allowed in season while hunting other game species per these map regulations.**

**H. FISHING – Fishing in the Disabled Fishing Pond is for disabled anglers only and is strictly catch and release.**

**I. ALCOHOL-** Persons under the influence of alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs or possessing and/or consuming alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs shall not be permitted to hunt and/or possess firearms on Division lands.



**A STAND/BLIND PERMIT MUST BE SHOWN BY EACH HUNTER PRIOR TO OBTAINING A DAILY HUNTING PERMIT DURING ALL DEER FIREARMS SEASONS**

**A. DEER HUNTING – GENERAL**

1. Deer hunting **will not be open** during the **Special October Antlerless Firearm Season, October Muzzleloader or Handgun Season**
2. A daily permit from the Little Creek Check Station is required to hunt (except for archery & crossbow hunters –See Deer – Archer & Crossbow below) A daily lottery for available stands will be held **1 ½ hours before legal shooting time** at the Little Creek Check Station and at **12:00 Noon** during the Shotgun and January Muzzleloader seasons. Hunters are advised to arrive at least 15 minutes prior to the lottery.
3. All permits must be returned to the checking station at the end of the day's hunt. **FAILURE TO RETURN PERMITS AND ACCURATELY REPORT HARVEST WILL RESULT IN LOSS OF HUNTING PRIVILEGES.**
4. Hunters with stands W1-W3 should park near the Logan Lane Tract residence; hunters with stands W4-W5 should park near the old courthouse on Logan Lane.
5. Hunters may not drive deer.
6. Hunters with stands W1-W3 may not shoot any deer in the agricultural ground near these stands. All deer must be taken in the woods or power line right-of-way portion of this tract.
7. Certain stands may occasionally be closed for other DNERR activities; notices will be posted at the tagboard and checking station if this occurs.
8. **There will be no handgun hunting permitted on the Wilson Slaughter/DNERR property.**

**B. DEER - ARCHERY & CROSSBOW**

1. Hunters must register for a deer stand at the tagboard on the Logan Lane Tract. Stands are available on a first-come, first-served basis. Hunters must place tags on empty hooks and sign the registration sheet. Hunters must remove tags when leaving the area.
2. Hunters may hunt from a state-built stand or use portable tree stands within 35 yards of a permanent stand. All parts of a portable stand must be removed at the end of the day's hunt and screw-in tree steps **will not be** allowed.
3. Archery & crossbow hunting is allowed Monday – Saturday in season.

**C. DEER – MUZZLELOADER**

Deer hunting with muzzleloader will be open every day of the January season by permit only. This area is not open during the October muzzleloader season.

**D. DEER – SHOTGUN**

Deer hunting with shotgun will be open every day of the November, December Antlerless and January seasons, by permit only. This area also will be open for the Youth Deer Hunt.

**E. TURKEY HUNTING**

1. A valid Ted Harvey Wildlife Area – Logan Lane Tract turkey hunting permit is required.
2. The areas open for hunting are the woods and powerline right-of-way near deer stands W1-W5. No turkeys may be taken on the agricultural ground surrounding this hunting area.

**F. FOX & COYOTE HUNTING**

**Fox and coyote hunting allowed in season while hunting other game species per these map regulations. Fox chasing is not permitted.**

**G. WATERFOWL HUNTING** Not allowed on this tract.



Following the initial drawing Blinds 32 – 44 (River and Roberts Island Duck Blinds) can be reissued by a waiting list until 1:00 PM each day.
2. All hunting must be from State-built blinds only (Blind locations shown on map).
3. **Hunt days and Hours: Blinds 32-37** (River Blinds) and **38-44** (Roberts Island) will be **open every day** of the duck season from **Legal Shooting time until sunset**. Hunters must vacate the area by one hour after sunset.
4. Permits must be returned to the checking station at the end of the days hunt.



**A. DOVE HUNTING**

Doves can be hunted on the entire wildlife area without a permit. **NO PERSON SHALL HUNT DOVES ON STATE WILDLIFE AREAS IN SEPTEMBER WHILE POSSESSING SHOT OTHER THAN APPROVED NON-TOXIC SHOT.**

**B. SMALL GAME**

1. Upland game (gray squirrel, rabbit, pheasant, quail, dove, woodcock, snipe, and crows) hunting will be allowed in season by permit Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays during November, December, January, & February EXCEPT -Closed Antlerless Deer Season.
2. Permits will be issued by lottery at 8:00 am at the Little Creek Check Station. Hunters must vacate the area by 3:30 pm daily.
3. One party of up to 4 hunters will be assigned to each tract.

**C. DEER HUNTING** – Non-resident hunters are prohibited from driving deer on state wildlife areas. Each organized deer drive limited to 6 participants (Delaware resident hunters only). Deer hunting allowed from the ground, from a portable stand, or from a state-built stand. **No permanent non-state built deer stands are allowed and all parts of a portable stand must be removed at the end of each hunting day. No screw-in steps or stands allowed.** Deer stand D7 has been modified to accommodate ambulatory disabled hunters.

**D. TURKEY HUNTING** - A valid Ted Harvey Wildlife Area turkey hunting permit is required.

**E. RACCOON HUNTING** – Raccoon hunting is allowed from September 1 until March 31 during legal raccoon hunting seasons.

**D. FOX & COYOTE HUNTING** – Fox chasing not allowed in not allowed on this tract. **Fox and coyote hunting allowed in season while hunting other game species per these map regulations.**

**E. WATERFOWL HUNTING** – Waterfowl hunting allowed in season. Hunters may take waterfowl **in fields only** by any legal means (jump shooting, etc). All waterfowl hunters are required to use non-toxic shot in all gauges. It is unlawful to possess lead shot while hunting waterfowl on the area. Special regulations will apply during the Snow Goose Conservation Order starting in early February.

**F. DOG TRAINING** – Rabbit dogs may be trained on Sundays during September, October, and November except for the Sunday during shotgun deer season.

**G. ALCOHOL** - Persons under the influence of alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs or possessing and/or consuming alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs shall not be permitted to hunt and/or possess firearms on Division lands.

**H. CARCASSES** – Disposal of dead animals or their parts on State Wildlife Areas is prohibited.

**STATE WILDLIFE AREA USE REGULATIONS  
FIREARMS**

No firearms on Division lands from March 1 - August 31 except by permit during legal hunting seasons or authorized by the Division in writing. Target shooting is prohibited. The discharge or possession of paint guns on state wildlife areas is prohibited.

**HUNTING**

Permitted only as designated on area maps. No trapping except by valid contract holders. Call 284-4795 or 739-9912 for information.

**VEHICLES**

Off-established road use of motorized vehicles (including tax ditch right-of-ways) is unlawful without a permit. Parking only allowed at designated parking areas.

**TRESPASS**

No entry into closed area or onto private land.

**HOURS**

Entry limited from sunrise to sunset except to lawfully hunt and fish.

**CAMPING/SWIMMING**

No unauthorized camping or swimming.





Persons may hunt on the Norman G. Wilder Wildlife Area only as directed by these rules, which have been established by Regulation 3908 of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103, 7 Delaware Code.

**Violators of wildlife area regulations may be subject to fines and/or revocation of their hunting privilege on state wildlife areas for up to one year.**

**Some areas may be closed to allow mentored hunting opportunities.**

**A. GENERAL REGULATIONS**

1. Except as noted in B-1 & B5 (below) hunting is not permitted on the beagle club and bird dog field trial areas and Safety Zones around buildings.
2. No off-highway vehicles, either registered or unregistered, permitted. Licensed motorized vehicles are only permitted on established and maintained roads. Parking only allowed at designated parking areas.
3. Horses may be used only on roads open to vehicular traffic or designated horse trails except for activities approved by the Division. Horseback riding during any firearms deer seasons is prohibited except Sundays.

**B. DEER HUNTING & TURKEY HUNTING**

1. Deer hunting is permitted in season EXCEPT DURING THE OCTOBER SPECIAL ANTLERLESS FIREARMS SEASONS on all areas including the bird dog trial area near the C & R Center (except as noted below) and dog training area near Berrytown Rd, but closed on the fenced beagle club area.
2. DURING THE YOUTH DEER AND HANDGUN SEASONS, FIREARM DEER HUNTING WILL BE PERMITTED ON THE ENTIRE AREA EXCEPT LIMITED TO ARCHERY & CROSSBOW ONLY ON THE BIRD DOG TRIAL AREA INCLUDING A 100 YARD PERIMETER AROUND THE TRAINING AREA NEAR THE C&R CENTER.
3. No permanent deer stands are allowed and all parts of a portable stand must be removed at the end of each hunting day. No screw-in stands or steps are allowed.
4. A handgun may be used in place of a shotgun for deer hunting during any shotgun deer seasons when a shotgun is a legal weapon. Handgun hunting for deer is permitted on this area during the January handgun season.
5. Turkey hunting allowed on all areas including the C&R Center grounds with a valid turkey hunting permit, but closed on the fenced beagle club area.

**C. SMALL GAME HUNTING, RACCOON, FOX, & COYOTE HUNTING**

1. **Small game hunting** allowed on all areas except the bird dog trial area near the C & R Center on the south side of C&R Center Road, the fenced-in beagle club area, and the safety zones around buildings. Small game hunting closed during the December and January deer shotgun seasons (open during January muzzleloader season and handgun season).

**NO PERSON SHALL HUNT DOVES ON STATE WILDLIFE AREAS IN SEPTEMBER WHILE POSSESSING SHOT OTHER THAN APPROVED NON-TOXIC SHOT.**

2. **Fox chasing** is allowed in season. Fox chasing is prohibited until 1:00 PM during the turkey hunting season. No fox chasing during any firearms deer seasons. **Fox and coyote hunting allowed in season while hunting other game species per these map regulations.**
3. **Raccoon hunting** is allowed from September 1 until March 31 during legal raccoon hunting season.

**D. WATERFOWL HUNTING**

1. Waterfowl hunting permitted in season. Special regulations will apply during the Snow Goose Conservation Order.

**E. DOG TRAINING & FIELD TRIALS**

See Norman G. Wilder Petersburg Tract Dog Training map for special regulations.

**F. ALCOHOL**

Persons under the influence of alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs or possessing and/or consuming alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs shall not be permitted to hunt and/or possess firearms on Division lands.

**G. CARCASSES**

Disposal of dead animals or their parts on State Wildlife Areas is prohibited.

**STATE WILDLIFE AREA USE REGULATIONS**

**FIREARMS** - No firearms on Division lands from March 1 – August 31 except by permit during legal hunting seasons and as authorized by the Division of Fish and Wildlife in writing. Target shooting is prohibited. Call Ommelanden Shooting Range for year-round target shooting information at 323-5333. Discharge or possession of paintball guns is prohibited

**HUNTING** - Permitted only as designated on area maps. No trapping except by valid contract holders.

**HOURS** - Entry limited from sunrise to sunset except to lawfully hunt and fish.

**CAMPING/SWIMMING** - No unauthorized camping or swimming.

2. A permit issued at the **Little Creek Checking Station** is required to hunt. The deer stand lottery will be held **1 ½ hours before legal shooting time and at 12:00 noon**. Hunters are advised to arrive at least 15 minutes prior to the start of the lottery to allow time to sign up.
3. Hunters must park in the parking lot (see map) and go directly to their stands; hunters must use state-built stands and **May NOT** drive deer.
4. All permits must be returned to the checking station at the end of the hunt.

**B. DEER – ARCHERY**

1. Archery hunting allowed Monday – Saturday in season on Gray Tract; no archery hunting during any of the November shotgun deer seasons. Archers must wear required hunter orange during any other firearms deer seasons.
2. Access to the area must be by boat. No access from or parking on Route 113 is permitted.
3. Archers may hunt anywhere on the tract, and may hunt from state-built stands, the ground or portable stands. No permanent stands may be built and all parts of a portable stand must be removed at the end of the days hunt. No screw-in tree steps or nailed deer stands are allowed.

**C. WATERFOWL HUNTING**

All waterfowl hunting from state blind sites only on a first-come, first-served basis on both tracts.

**Hunters may hunt within a 35 yard radius of blind site sign. Non toxic shot is required for all waterfowl hunting in Delaware.** Special regulations will apply during the Snow Goose Conservation Order starting in early February.

**D. UPLAND GAME, FOX, COYOTE, AND TURKEY HUNTING, DOG TRAINING**

**1. NO UPLAND GAME OR TURKEY HUNTING OR DOG TRAINING ON THESE TRACTS.**

2. Fox and coyote hunting allowed in season while hunting other game species per these map regulations.





MILFORD NECK WILDLIFE AREA  
PENUEL AND COVERDALE TRACTS**

Persons may hunt on the Milford Neck Wildlife Area-Penuel and Coverdale tracts only as directed by these rules, which have been established by Regulation 3908 of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103, 7 Delaware Code.

**Violators of wildlife area regulations may be subject to fines and/or revocation of their hunting privileges on state wildlife areas for up to one year.**

**Some areas may be closed to allow mentored hunting opportunities.**

**Fox and coyote hunting allowed on both tracts in season while hunting other game species per these map regulations.**

**DOG TRAINING** – Rabbit dogs may be trained on both tracts on Sundays during September, October, and November except for the Sunday during shotgun deer season.

**PENUEL TRACT**

**A. DEER, TURKEY, & UPLAND GAME HUNTING**

1. Hunting permitted in season, except for refuge located in the northeast corner of tract. Small game hunting open in season including during special October antlerless deer seasons and January handgun season.
2. Small game hunting **closed during the December and January deer shotgun seasons (Open during January muzzleloader season).**
3. Turkey hunters must possess a valid Milford Neck Wildlife Area turkey hunting permit.
4. No permanent deer stands may be built and no screw-in tree steps allowed. All parts of a portable stand must be removed at the end of the days hunt. Deer hunters must register at the tagboard located at the main parking lot. No one may register prior to 4:00 A.M. on the morning of the hunt.
5. Deer stand 8 has been modified to accommodate ambulatory disabled hunters.
6. Raccoon hunting is allowed from September 1 until March 31 during legal raccoon hunting seasons.
7. A handgun may be used in place of a shotgun for deer hunting during any deer shotgun season when a shotgun is a legal weapon. Handgun hunting for deer is permitted on this area during the January handgun season.
8. Fox chasing allowed in season but is prohibited until 1:00 PM during turkey season.

**B. WATERFOWL HUNTING**

1. Waterfowl hunting within a 35 yard radius from blind sites **ONLY** on a first-come, first-served basis on Murderkill River and Beaver Dam Branch north of dirt bridge. See opposite side for locations. South of dirt bridge jump shooting permitted in branch.
2. Waterfowl hunting permitted in agricultural fields in season, **except during firearm deer seasons.** No waterfowl hunting from hedgerow which serves as the eastern boundary of the property. Hunters may pick locations on a first-come, first-serve basis.
3. Special regulations will apply during the Snow Goose Conservation order starting in early February.

**C. DOVE HUNTING**

1. Dove hunting allowed on the entire tract on a non-permit basis.

**NO PERSON SHALL HUNT DOVES ON STATE WILDLIFE AREAS IN SEPTEMBER WHILE POSSESSING SHOT OTHER THAN APPROVED NON-TOXIC SHOT.**

**COVERDALE TRACT**

**A. DEER, TURKEY & UPLAND GAME HUNTING**

1. Small game and deer hunting permitted in season on the entire tract, except for safety zones around the residences.
2. Small game hunting **closed during the December and January deer shotgun seasons (open during January muzzleloader season).**
3. Turkey hunters must possess a valid Milford Neck Wildlife Area turkey hunting permit.
4. No permanent deer stands may be built and no screw-in tree steps allowed. All parts of a portable stand must be removed at the end of the days hunt.
5. All hunters must park in the designated parking lots located off of Milford Neck Road (CR120).
6. No raccoon hunting is permitted. Fox chasing not allowed.
7. Dove hunting allowed on entire tract on a non-permit basis.
8. A handgun may be used in place of a shotgun for deer hunting during any shotgun season when a shotgun is a legal weapon. Handgun hunting for deer is not permitted on this area during the January handgun seasons.

**B. WATERFOWL HUNTING: NO WATERFOWL HUNTING ALLOWED ON THE COVERDALE TRACT**

**STATE WILDLIFE AREA USE REGULATIONS**

**FIREARMS**

No firearms on Division lands from March 1 – August 31 except by permit during legal hunting seasons or as authorized by the Division of Fish and Wildlife in writing. Target shooting is prohibited. Discharge or possession of paintball guns is prohibited.

**HUNTING**

**Permitted only as designated on area maps.** No trapping except by valid contract holders.

**VEHICLES**

No off highway vehicles, either registered or unregistered are permitted. Licensed motorized vehicles are only permitted on established and maintained roads.

**TRESPASS**

**No entry into closed areas.**

**HOURS**

Entry limited from **sunrise to sunset** except to lawfully hunt and fish.



**A. DEER, SMALL GAME & WATERFOWL**  
**Small game hunting allowed in season on this entire tract except the dog training area as designated on the area map.**

1. Small game hunting is prohibited during the December and January shotgun deer seasons (open during January muzzleloader season).
2. Non-resident hunters may not participate in deer drives, and residents limited to 6 drivers during organized drives.
3. No permanent deer stands are allowed and all parts of a portable stand must be removed at the end of the hunting day.
4. Handgun hunting for deer is permitted on this area during the special Jan. handgun season.
5. Waterfowl hunting allowed in season. Special regulations will apply during the Snow Goose Conservation Order starting in early February.

**B. TURKEY**

1. A valid Milford Neck Wildlife Area turkey hunting permit is required. The drawing for permits will be held in early December. See the Hunting & Trapping guide or call 284-1077 for more information.

**C. FOX CHASING, FOX & COYOTE HUNTING, AND RACCOON HUNTING**

1. Raccoon hunting is allowed from September 1 until March 31 during legal raccoon hunting seasons.
2. Fox chasing allowed in season except prohibited until 1:00 PM during the turkey season. Fox and coyote hunting allowed in season while hunting other game species per these map regulations.

**D. DOG TRAINING**

1. Dog training permitted on designated training area (see front of map) all year, except closed during November firearm deer season and turkey season. Firearms not permitted for training outside of hunting seasons. **Rabbit dogs may be trained on this entire tract on Sundays during September, October, and November except for the Sunday during shotgun deer season.**
2. No small game hunting on designated dog training area.

- E. CARCASSES** – Disposal of dead animals or their parts on State Wildlife Areas is prohibited.

- F. ALCOHOL** - Persons under the influence of alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs or possessing and/or consuming alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs shall not be permitted to hunt and/or possess firearms on Division lands.

Fox chasing allowed in season but is prohibited until 1:00 p.m. during the turkey season. **Fox and coyote hunting allowed in season while hunting other game species per these map regulations.** Raccoon hunting allowed from September 1 – March 31 during legal raccoon hunting seasons.

**D. WATERFOWL**

**WATERFOWL HUNTING ON ENTIRE AREA, INCLUDING RAWLEY’S ISLAND MUST BE FROM DESIGNATED BLIND SITES ONLY.**


