MILFORD NECK WILDLIFE AREA – RAWLEY’S ISLAND TRACT

Persons may hunt on the Milford Neck Wildlife Area – Rawley’s Island Tract only as directed by these rules, which have been established by Regulation 3908 of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103, 7 Delaware Code.

Violators of wildlife area regulations may be subject to fines and/or revocation of their hunting privilege on state wildlife areas for up to one year.

Some areas may be closed to allow mentored hunting opportunities.

A. DEER & SMALL GAME

1. Hunting permitted in season within property lines designated on this map. Small game hunting is prohibited during the December and January shotgun deer seasons (open during January muzzleloader season and January handgun season).
2. Access to Rawley’s Island area must be made from Grecos Canal, Crooked Gut, Mispillion River and surrounding marsh areas.
3. This area is open for the special October antlerless deer season.
4. No permanent deer stands are allowed and all parts of a portable stand must be removed at the end of the days hunt. No screw-in steps or stands are allowed.
5. A handgun may be used in place of a shotgun for deer hunting during any shotgun deer season when a shotgun is a legal weapon. Handgun deer hunting is permitted on this area during the January handgun season.
6. **No person shall hunt doves on state wildlife areas in September while possessing shot other than approved non-toxic shot.**

B. TURKEY

1. A valid Milford Neck Wildlife Area turkey hunting permit is required.

C. FOX, COYOTE, AND RACCOON HUNTING

Fox chasing allowed in season but is prohibited until 1:00 p.m. during the turkey season. **Fox and coyote hunting allowed in season while hunting other game species per these map regulations.** Raccoon hunting allowed from September 1 – March 31 during legal raccoon hunting seasons.

D. WATERFOWL

WATERFOWL HUNTING ON ENTIRE AREA, INCLUDING RAWLEY’S ISLAND MUST BE FROM DESIGNATED BLIND SITES ONLY.

1. Hunters must waterfowl hunt from designated blind sites available on a first come, first served basis. Blind sites are designated on the front of the area map. Hunters may construct temporary blinds within a 35 yard radius of blind site sign.
2. Access to Rawley’s Island must be made from Grecos Canal, Crooked Gut, Mispillion River and surrounding marsh areas.
3. All waterfowl hunters are required to use non-toxic shot in all gauges. It is unlawful to possess lead shot while waterfowl hunting.
4. Special regulations will apply during the Snow Goose Conservation Order starting in early February.

STATE WILDLIFE AREA USE REGULATIONS

FIREARMS

No firearms on Division lands from March 1 – August 31 except by permit during legal hunting seasons or as

authorized by the Division of Fish and Wildlife in writing. Target shooting is prohibited. Discharge or possession of paint guns is prohibited.

HUNTING

Permitted only as designated on area maps. No trapping except by valid contract holders.

VEHICLES

No off-highway vehicles, either registered or unregistered, permitted. Licensed motorized vehicles are only permitted on established and maintained roads.

TRESPASS

No entry into closed area.

HOURS

Entry limited from sunrise to sunset except to lawfully hunt and fish.

CAMPING/SWIMMING

No unauthorized camping or swimming.

DUMPING

Dumping is strictly prohibited.

ALCOHOL - Persons under the influence of alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs or possessing and/or consuming alcoholic beverages, liquors, or drugs shall not be permitted to hunt and/or possess firearms on Division lands.

HORSEBACK RIDING

Horses may be used only on established roads open to vehicular traffic except for activities approved by the Division.
