



C&D CANAL CONSERVATION AREA**

Persons may hunt on the Chesapeake and Delaware Canal Wildlife Area only as directed by the above rules, which have been established by Wildlife Regulation 3908 (WR-3908) of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103, 7 Delaware Code.

PERSONS UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES OR DRUGS OR POSSESSING OR CONSUMING ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES OR DRUGS SHALL NOT BE PERMITTED TO HUNT AND/OR POSSESS FIREARMS ON DIVISION LANDS.

A. MIKE CASTLE RECREATION TRAIL

(See Mike Castle Trail map for additional trail rules)

1. Hunters may use the trail and parking areas to access the neighboring wildlife area lands, however, all firearms must be unloaded, including bolt removed from crossbow and cap/primer removed from muzzleloader, while on the trail or within any of the trail parking areas.
2. No person shall discharge any firearm while on or within 15 yards of the recreation trail or within any posted safety zone associated with the trail.
3. All dogs must be leashed while on the recreation trail or within any of the trail parking areas. Dog owners shall be responsible for cleanup and removal of any feces deposited by the animal.
4. Unauthorized motor vehicles prohibited on the recreation trail.

B. GENERAL HUNTING REGULATIONS

1. Hunters are cautioned not to trespass on private lands.
2. The Summit Retriever Training Area is closed to hunting except during the archery and firearm deer seasons, however, deer hunting will not be permitted during the Special October Antlerless Firearm Season.
3. No hunting is permitted within posted safety zones and refuges. Hunters are cautioned that several new safety zones have been established (See attached map)

C. UPLAND SMALL GAME AND DEER HUNTING

1. Deer and upland small game hunting is prohibited in Scotts Run (See map).
2. Deer hunting will be permitted on this area during the Special October Antlerless Firearm Season (**except within the Summit Retriever Training Area where only archery hunting will be permitted**). Archery hunters during this special season and other firearm seasons must wear required hunter orange.
3. No permanent stands or structures are allowed and all parts of portable stands must be removed at the end of the day. No portable stands or tree steps that cause damage to trees are allowed.
4. Deer hunting by driving is permitted on the Chesapeake and Delaware Canal Wildlife Area between the hours of 9:00 am and 3:00 p.m. No more than six (6) resident hunters may participate in actively driving deer at any one time. Non-residents may not participate in actively driving deer and must hunt from stationary locations.
5. Upland small game hunting is closed during the December and January shotgun deer seasons.
6. Falconry seasons and regulations are the same as upland small game hunting.

7. Handgun hunting for deer is not permitted on this area.
8. Rabbit dogs may be trained on Sundays during September, October, and November except for the Sunday during November shotgun deer season.

D. WATERFOWL HUNTING

1. Waterfowl hunting is prohibited in Scott's Run and the Summit Retriever Training Area.
2. Jump shooting of waterfowl is permitted on other areas of the C&D Canal Wildlife Area.

E. FIREARMS AND PAINTBALL GUNS

1. No firearms on lands administered by the Division from March 1 – August 31 except by permit during legal hunting seasons or authorized by the Division of Fish and Wildlife.
2. Target shooting is prohibited.
3. No rifles permitted.
4. The discharge or possession of paintball guns on lands administered by the Division is prohibited.


E. DOG TRAINING REGULATIONS.

- F. TRAPPING.** Not permitted except with a valid state contract or permit.

- G. Vehicles.** Motorized vehicles are only permitted on established and maintained roads. All motorized vehicles must be licensed.

- H. HORSEBACK RIDING -** Horses may be used only on established recreation trail.



2. Jump shooting of waterfowl is permitted on other areas of the C&D Canal Wildlife Area.

E. FIREARMS AND PAINTBALL GUNS

1. No firearms on lands administered by the Division from March 1 – August 31 except by permit during legal hunting seasons or authorized by the Division of Fish and Wildlife.
2. Target shooting is prohibited.
3. No rifles permitted.
4. The discharge or possession of paintball guns on lands administered by the Division is prohibited.

E. DOG TRAINING REGULATIONS.



WEST SECTION & DOG TRAINING AREAS**

GENERAL DOG TRAINING REGULATIONS

1. Dog training activities restricted to designated areas March 1– August 31 (See attached map). From September 1-February 28 dog training permitted on any suitable area within the C&D Canal Wildlife Area during open hunting seasons for the game that the dog is being trained to hunt.
2. During field trial and organized training events, permitted by the Division, dog training areas may be closed to the public. A signage system at appropriate access areas will be used to provide notice when a permitted field trial or training event is occurring.
3. No permits needed to train dogs on dog training areas provided live birds are not being used. If live birds are used a dog training permit is required (Call 302-739-9912).
4. Motorized vehicles are prohibited off established and maintained roadways including within dog training areas.
5. Firearms prohibited on lands administered by the Division from March 1 – August 31, except during legal hunting seasons or on areas established as a designated dog training area.
6. Target shooting is prohibited.
7. No rifles permitted

SUMMIT RETRIEVER TRAINING AREA

1. The Division has established a retriever training area along the northside of the canal between Route 896 and Guthrie Run (a.k.a The Waterfall). This area is restricted to the training of sporting dogs in the act of retrieving (See attached map).
2. In a cooperative stewardship agreement, the Delaware Bay Retriever Club is assisting the Division in the management of this area. **Except during permitted field trial and organized training events, the club does not maintain any exclusive use of the area and the area is open to all members of the public engaged in the act of retriever training.**
3. The Summit Retriever Training Area is closed to hunting except during the archery and firearm deer seasons (See Exception below).
4. No dog training is permitted during any firearm deer seasons, except on Sundays.
5. **Firearm deer hunting will not be permitted in the Summit Retriever Training Area during the Special October Antlerless Firearm Season** and as such dog training is permitted. Archery hunting will be permitted; archers must wear required hunter orange during any concurrent firearm deer season.
6. It is unlawful to enter the Summit Retriever Training Area for any purpose other than to train dogs in the act of retrieving or to hunt deer during the firearm or archery deer


seasons. It is unlawful to fish, operate model or full size boats, ride horses or bicycles, or conduct any other activity on the area.

OTHER SPORTING DOG TRAINING AREAS -

The Bowl Sporting Dog Area is located immediately west of the Summit Retriever Training Area, along the northside of the canal between Guthries Run and the Maryland State Line. The training of all sporting dogs is permitted within this area. Hunting and falconry is also permitted within this area.

3. All dogs must be leashed while on the recreation trail or within any of the trail parking areas. Dog owners shall be responsible for cleanup and removal of any feces deposited by the animal.



DEER & UPLAND HUNTING

Persons may hunt on the Augustine Wildlife Area only as directed by the following rules, which have been established by Wildlife Regulations 3908 (WR-3908) of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103, 7 Delaware Code.

Violators of wildlife area regulations may be subject to fines and or revocation of their hunting privileges on state wildlife areas for up to one year.

PERMITS

A STAND/BLIND PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO HUNT DURING ALL DEER FIREARMS AND WATERFOWL SEASONS.

A. DEER – FIREARM – SHOTGUN, MUZZLELOADER, HANDGUN BY PERMIT ONLY

1. Area is for Youth and Non ambulatory deer hunting only.
2. Permits issued via daily lottery drawing at the Augustine Lottery Station.
3. Daily permits issued 1 1/2 hours before legal shooting time. Vacant stands will then be re-issued by a second lottery at 12:00 PM. No permits issued after 1:00 PM
4. **Deer hunting in this area will NOT be permitted during the Special October Antlerless Firearm Season. Archery hunting will be permitted; however, archers must wear required hunter orange.**
5. Handguns may be used in place of a shotgun during any deer season when a shotgun is legal.
6. Only one firearm is permitted/deer stand.
7. Deer hunters must park in appropriate parking lots (see maps) and go directly to their stands.
8. Hunters may not “drive” deer and must hunt from state-built stands.
9. **Handgun deer hunting will not be allowed on the Aston Tract during the January handgun season.**

B. UPLAND HUNTING

1. Upland small game hunting is not currently permitted on this tract.



WATERFOWL

PERMITS

A STAND/BLIND PERMIT IS REQUIRED TO HUNT DURING ALL DEER FIREARMS AND WATERFOWL SEASONS.

A. WATERFOWL HUNTING REGULATIONS

1. Hunting by permit only, issued by a daily lottery held at the **Augustine Lottery Station**. See Lottery Station Attendant for lottery application details.
2. **Permits are issued from 1 1/2 hours before legal shooting time until 1:00 P.M.**
3. Hunting days and Hours: **Opening days, Mondays, Wednesdays, Fridays, Saturdays, and Thanksgiving during the regular waterfowl seasons from 1/2 hour before sunrise until sunset.**
NOTE: Area may be closed during the early and late snow goose seasons, and hunting days and hours may differ during the September Teal Season. To assure the area is open; please call the Augustine Wildlife Area at 834-8433 or the Dover Office at 739-9912.
4. All hunting from state-built pits, blinds, and blind sites only (locations on maps).
5. No more than 3 persons may occupy one pit or blind.
6. Park in appropriate parking lots (see maps). Do not drive into fields.
7. No airboats.
8. No waterfowl hunting from upland fields, except from designated goose blinds.

9. **No gasoline operated motors in this area. Electric trolling motors are permitted.**
10. Hunters using duck blinds in the tide marsh must have a boat and required safety equipment to hunt. See Delaware Hunting and Trapping Guide for regulations.
11. Hunters must vacate all hunting areas by one hour after sunset.
12. This area will be open during the Snow Goose Conservation Order. See official seasons and regulations. **No permit or sign-in required during the conservation order.**

Caution: Pilings at the mouth of the Lang Marsh may be covered at high tide – navigate with extreme caution. Ditches may go dry at low tide.

B. FIREARMS

No firearms on Division lands from March 1 - August 31 except by permit during legal hunting seasons authorized by the Division of Fish and Wildlife. Target shooting is prohibited.

B. FIREARMS - No firearms on Division lands from March 1 - August 31 except by permit during legal hunting seasons authorized by the Division of Fish and Wildlife. Target shooting is prohibited.



DEER, UPLAND, AND WATERFOWL HUNTING

Persons may hunt on the Blackbird Reserve Wildlife Area only as directed by the following rules, which have been established by Wildlife Regulation 3908 (WR-3908) of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103, 7 Delaware Code.

PERSONS UNDER THE INFLUENCE OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES OR DRUGS OR POSSESSING OR CONSUMING ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES OR DRUGS SHALL NOT BE PERMITTED TO HUNT AND/OR POSSESS FIREARMS ON DIVISION LANDS.

SOME AREAS MAY BE CLOSED TO ALLOW MENTORED HUNTING OPPORTUNITIES.

A. DEER – ARCHERY

1. Archery hunters may hunt anywhere within the Blackbird Reserve Wildlife Area (excluding refuges and safety zones) without special permits.
2. Archery hunters may use portable stands however all parts of portable stands must be removed at the end of the day. No stands or screw in tree steps which cause damage to trees are allowed.
3. Archery hunters may hunt from existing permanent stands located on the property on a first-come, first-served basis. **EXISTING STANDS ARE NOT MAINTAINED BY THE STATE AND SHOULD BE USED WITH EXTREME CAUTION.**
4. Archery hunting will be permitted during the muzzleloader and shotgun seasons provided that hunters wear at least 400 square inches of hunter orange on the head, chest, and back.
5. Hunters should be advised that concurrent archery and small game hunting will be permitted during times where open seasons overlap.

B. UPLAND HUNTING


1. Small game hunters may hunt anywhere within the Blackbird Reserve Wildlife Area (excluding refuges and safety zones) without special permits, but must register at the tagboards located in the specific parking areas. See registration procedures on sign-in sheets. No registration is required for the Gardner Road Tract.
2. Upland hunting is limited to parties of no more than 4 hunters per party.
3. Upland hunters may not take or attempt to take waterfowl.
4. Hunting within the posted safety zones or refuges is prohibited and hunters and their dogs may not enter a refuge for any reason.
5. Hunters should be advised that concurrent archery and small game hunting will be

permitted during times where open seasons overlap.

6. Dove hunting is permitted on the entire area during all regular dove seasons, no special permit required. **During the month of September, ALL dove hunting on State Wildlife Areas will require the use of non-toxic shot.** All additional state and federal regulations apply.
7. The area is open to raccoon hunting from September 1 – March 31 no permit required.
8. Falconry seasons and regulations are the same as upland small game hunting.

C. WATERFOWL HUNTING – NONE PERMITTED

1. No waterfowl hunting is permitted on the Blackbird Reserve Wildlife Area.



HUNTING

Persons may hunt on the Delaware National Estuarine Research Reserve only as directed by the following rules, which have been established by Wildlife Regulation 3908 (WR-3908) of the Division of Fish and Wildlife, pursuant to Section 103, 7 Delaware Code.

Violators of wildlife area regulations may be subject to fines and or revocation of their hunting privileges on state wildlife areas for up to one year.

FAILURE TO RETURN YOUR HARVEST DATA CARD (PERMIT) MAY RESULT IN LOSS OF HUNTING PRIVILEGES, AS ACCURATE HARVEST DATA IS VITAL TO PROPER MANAGEMENT OF THIS AREA.

Some areas may be closed to allow mentored hunting opportunities.

A. DEER – FIREARM

1. Shotgun hunting by permit only.
2. Shotgun deer permits (**November and November Youth Hunt shotgun seasons only**) will be issued by a daily lottery drawing at the Cedar Swamp Lottery Station.
3. Daily permits issued 1 1/2 hours before legal shooting time. Vacant stands will then be re-issued by a second lottery at 12:00 PM. No permits issued after 1:00 PM. **Hunters are advised to arrive early to participate.**
4. All permits must be filled out and deposited in the drop boxes located on the area or lottery station at the end of the day's hunt. Failure to accurately report harvest and return permits will result in loss of hunting privileges.
5. **Deer hunting in this area will not be permitted during the Special October Antlerless Firearm Season.**
6. Deer hunters must park in appropriate parking lots (see maps) and go directly to their stands.
7. Hunters may not "drive" deer and must hunt from state-built stands.
8. Only one firearm is permitted/deer stand.
9. **This area will not be open to archery or muzzleloader deer hunting.**
