At 236 acres, the Anne McClements Woods Track of the Fork Branch Nature Preserve is the largest forested area within Dover City limits. Located in the headwaters of the St. Jones River, a large portion of the forest contains trees older than 150 years. The Division of Parks & Recreation proposes to construct a small trailhead and 2.75 miles of trail to create public access to the Preserve. The proposed trail alignment is sensitive to cultural and natural resources, trail conditions and visitor use. Please use this form to provide comments to the proposed trail alignment.
