# Camping/Overnight Accommodations

- The primitive group campsite is moving from near the Carpenter Recreation Area to the Nine-Foot Road area. It will have better ADA accessibility and be more easily monitored by Rangers.
- No other campsites/accommodations exist in White Clay Creek State Park. Some initial feedback indicates mixed interest about campsites/accommodations.
- Parks that offer camping/accommodations typically have one or more of the following accommodations: tent sites (with or without water/electric), yurts, cabins, cottages, and RV sites.
- Parks in New Castle County have 70 RV sites, 5 tent sites, 4 equestrian campsites, and 2 yurts for a combined 81 sites/accommodations (all at Lums Pond State Park)
- Parks in Kent and Sussex Counties have 664 RV sites, 85 tent sites, and 45 other accommodations for a combined 794 sites/accommodations
- Underutilized buildings within the Park may be a future opportunity for overnight accommodations
