Fishing

- Trout fishing in April is tremendously popular in the Park
- 10,550 pounds of regular-sized (3/4 to 1/2 pound) rainbow and brown trout are stocked in the springtime, along with 700 pounds of “trophy” fish (approx. 2 pounds each)
- 1,000 pounds of regular-sized trout are stocked again in the fall
- Parking areas and roads become overcrowded and problematic during trout season
- All fishing from the Creek is closed 2 weeks prior to stocking
- The section of Creek north of Chambers Rock Rd. is limited to fly fishing
- Several ponds offer year-round fishing for panfish and bass (catch and release)
- The pond near the Smith Mill Rd./Possum Hill parking area should soon be ADA accessible, receiving a new paved pathway from the new parking lot and accessible piers into the pond
- Fishing licenses are required at all times and trout stamps are required for trout fishing in Apr., May, Jun., Oct., and Nov.
