1. Updated Forms Provided by the DNREC Sediment and Stormwater Program

2. Sediment and Stormwater Plan Expiration Date

This is a reminder that Delaware Sediment and Stormwater Plans remain valid for three years from the date of an approval, unless specifically extended or renewed by the appropriate plan approval agency. Verify that the most current plans are being used onsite. They must be kept on site at all times.

The next one-day Certified Construction Reviewer (CCR) Recertification class is scheduled for Thursday, October 29, 2009. Registration is required. The class will run from 8:30am-4:30pm and you must be present for full duration of course.

Enrollment is “first come, first serve”, and you will not be guaranteed a seat until your registration form and the fee are received. The registration fee must be paid in advance by October 22nd.

Please be advised that if you do not attend the October 29th course and your certification is up for renewal, you will be required to attend the next 3½-day CCR course (March 2010) and pass the written exam.

5. Link of the Month: Revised Delaware Environmental Navigator (beta)

DNREC has released a beta version of its revised Delaware Environmental Navigator (DEN) Web application. With this application, users are able to search and explore the various spatial data layers available at the Department through their Web browser. While not all layers have been migrated to this version, eventually all available layers will be accessible through this application and the original DEN will be phased out. Users are encouraged to submit feedback during this testing period. Also of interest, it has been proposed to the Technical Subcommittee of the Regulatory Advisory Committee that this application could serve as the central clearing house for the Department's GIS data as required for the proposed Pre-Application process.
