1. **Pre-Registration Required: May 2, 2012 Blue Card Class**

DNREC will be holding the next Contractor's Certification Course on **May 2, 2012**. The Contractor's Certification Course, also known as the "Blue Card Course", is a ½-day course that gives an overview of the Sediment and Stormwater Program, its regulations, and required erosion and sediment control measures in the State of Delaware. Under the Delaware Sediment & Stormwater Regulations, at least one person in responsible charge of a construction site must have successfully completed the Contractor's Certification Course. 3. **UPDATE: Proposed Revisions to Sed. & SW Regulations**

The public comment period on the proposed revisions to the *Delaware Sediment and Stormwater Regulations* closed at the end of March. The next step in the process is the completion of the Hearing Officer's Report, followed by the formal issuance of the Secretary's Order. These steps are not required to follow a prescribed time schedule, but are expected to be completed within the next couple months. 4. **Link of the Month: Amazon.com Middletown Site Web Cam**

One of the largest active construction projects in the State is a proposed distribution center for Amazon.com that is currently underway in Middletown, DE. The site is owned and being developed by Duke Realty, a national commercial development company. Once the +1M sq. ft. building and site work have been completed, the facility will be leased to Amazon.com. As with all their active development projects, Duke has temporarily installed a Web cam on one of the

Town of Middletown's water towers that overlooks the site. Viewers are able to see snapshots of the active construction site and track progress through archived and time lapse images. The Web cam for "Project Tango" can be viewed from the following link:
