### 1. **2012 CCR Recertification Course: November 14, 2012**

The 2012 Certified Construction Reviewer (CCR) Recertification Course will be held on **November 14, 2012**. Additional information regarding registration and fees will be provided in this listserv as the date draws nearer.

### 2. **UPDATE: Proposed Revisions to Sed. & SW Regulations**

The public comment period on the proposed revisions to the *Delaware Sediment and Stormwater Regulations* closed at the end of March. The next step in the process is the completion of the Hearing Officer's Report, followed by the formal issuance of the Secretary's Order. These steps are not required to follow a prescribed time schedule, but are expected to be completed within the next couple months.
