Work consists of approximately 3,300 ft. water main, 2,000 ft. of gravity sewer, 1,000 ft. of sewage force main, 690 ft. of jack and bores; mechanical and electrical improvements to an existing sewage pump station. In addition, the construction of a new water treatment plant utilizing manganese greensand filters, inclusive of the foundation, masonry structure, roofing, equipment, coatings, new 500 gpm 12-inch cased water supply well, mechanical, electrical, and all appurtenances. Pipeline work will include all appurtenances including but not limited to valves, hydrants, manholes, restoration, and paving.

**PUBLIC HEARING**

The Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control (DNREC), Division of Watershed Stewardship, Shoreline and Waterway Management Section will conduct a public hearing on the proposed amendments to **7 DE Admin. Code 5102, Regulations Governing Beach Protection and the Use of Beaches**. The purpose of this proposed regulatory action is to incorporate recent legislative changes to Delaware's existing Beach Preservation Act (7 Del.C., Chapter 68). Additionally, the Department seeks to incorporate Division policies and construction standards into Delaware's aforementioned existing Beach regulations, which will result in less damage to structures, and offer additional protections of the dune and beach resource.

**The public hearing on the proposed amendments to 7 DE Admin. Code 5102, Regulations Governing Beach Protection and the Use of Beaches will be held November 7, 2015, beginning at 10AM at the Lewes Fire Department, Station Two, 32198 Janice Road, Lewes, DE 19958.**
