Examination Procedures & Registration Form**

“Regulations for Licensing Operators of Wastewater Facilities”, Section 7 - Examination

| 7.01 | The Board, or its authorized designee, shall prepare written examinations to be used in determining knowledge, ability, and judgment of the operators. |
| 7.02 | Examinations shall be held at places and times as set by the Board, with a suitable method of advance announcement made by the Board. Examinations shall be conducted at least semi-annually. |
| 7.03 | Examinations shall be written, unless the Board determines that an alternate format is necessary. All examinations will be graded by the Board, or by others designated by the Board, and the applicant notified of the outcome. Papers will not be returned to the applicant. However, a method will be provided to review the results with a member of the Board or its authorized designee on request by the applicant. |
| 7.04 | Separate examinations shall be prepared to cover each class of operator, as established in Section 6.03. |
| 7.05 | Any person who has failed the written examination for a particular operator class on three (3) consecutive occasions shall then satisfactorily complete an approved educational examination review course prior to again being considered to take that particular class of written examination. |

1. Eligibility

The Board of Certification for Wastewater Operators (BOC) does not have eligibility requirements for individuals registering to take the Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator Examination (exam).

The BOC administers the exam semi-annually, the second Friday in January and the second Friday in June (generally at Delaware Technical and Community College, Terry Campus).

2. Fee

A \$100 non-refundable fee is due at time of registration. Checks (payable to the Division of Water Resources) and cash are accepted. Credit card payments are not accepted.

3. Registration Form

The Exam Registration Form (registration) must be typewritten or clearly printed and complete. Incomplete registrations will not be processed and will be returned to the applicant; this could delay or nullify the applicant’s ability to take the exam.

Registrations received without the fee included will not be processed and will be returned to the applicant; this could delay or nullify the applicant’s ability to take the exam.

Applicants who register for the exam and don’t show up or notify the BOC, must re-register for the next exam and pay the \$100 non-refundable fee (emergency situations will be reviewed by the BOC).

4. **Deadline**
REGISTRATIONS MUST BE RECEIVED BY THE DNREC - SWDS OFFICE NO LATER THAN 14 CALENDAR DAYS PRIOR TO THE EXAM. However, applicants are encouraged to submit their applications at least 60 days in advance, if at all possible.

If an applicant is unable to submit the registration no later than 14 calendar days prior to the exam, completed registrations and \$100 non-refundable fee must be hand delivered to DNREC, SWDS at 89 Kings Highway, Dover, DE prior to the exam date.

Walk in registrations will not be accepted on the exam day.

5. **Notification**
The applicant will receive a confirmation letter with the exam date, registration time, room location and map (provided that the applicant's registration was received 14 calendar days prior to the exam).

6. **Examination Day**
Applicants must bring a form of photo identification and a calculator to the exam.

Personal belongings other than calculators are not permitted, applicants will be asked to remove all other personal belongings from exam location.

The BOC will provide pencils, resource booklets, exam booklets and scantron answer sheets.

The exam is multiple choice and true/false. A score of 75% or higher is required to pass.

7. **Results**
Within four (4) to six (6) weeks of taking the exam the applicant will receive an exam status letter (pass/fail). Exam papers and scores will not be returned, simply a pass or fail status.

Test results will be on file for a period of three (3) years.

8. **Failure to Pass the Exam**
If an applicant fails the exam for a particular operator class on three (3) consecutive occasions, they will then have to satisfactorily complete an approved education exam review course prior to being considered to take the exam again.

9. **Certification Process**
***Very Important:** An applicant passing the exam is not a guaranteed issuance of a wastewater operator's license.*

After receiving notification that an applicant has passed the exam they have three (3) years from the date of the exam to:

- Submit a completed Application for Certification, educational transcripts (a requirement for new licensees only) and a \$50 non-refundable fee.
- Must be operating in Delaware or have a written job offer to operate in Delaware.
- If an applicant does not meet the experience or educational requirements (as outlined on page 3) they may, with the approval of the BOC, receive an Operator-In-Training (OIT) license, pending fulfillment of these requirements.

Wastewater Treatment Plant Operator Qualifications

Per Section 6.03 of the Regulations for Licensing Operators of Wastewater Facilities

<u>Class</u>	<u>Education</u>		<u>Experience</u>
I	High School Diploma	<i>Plus</i>	One (1) year of acceptable operating experience
II	High School Diploma	<i>Plus</i>	Three (3) years of acceptable operating experience in Wastewater Facilities of Class I or higher
III	High School Diploma and two (2) years of approved college level education in engineering or allied subjects	<i>Plus</i>	Four (4) years of acceptable operating experience in Wastewater Facilities of Class II or higher; two (2) years of which must have been in a position of Direct Responsible Charge (DRC)
IV	A college degree or completion of four (4) years in a standard curriculum in engineering or allied subjects	<i>Plus</i>	Four (4) years of acceptable operating experience in Wastewater Facilities of Class III or higher, two (2) years of which must have been in a position of Direct Responsible Charge (DRC)

6.02 (d) Where applicable, education may be substituted for a portion of operating experience as specified below:

- [i] Where education or training is substituted for operating experience, it shall not exceed an amount which would reduce the requirement of actual operating experience to less than one (1) year for Class I, or less than two (2) years actual operating experience for Classes II, III, and IV.
- [ii] Education applied to the operating experience requirement cannot also be applied to the education requirement.
- [iii] College Level education in engineering or allied subjects, or equivalent, as approved by the Board, may be substituted on a year-for-year basis for operating experience (any Wastewater Facility Classification).
- [iv] Specialized operator training courses, correspondence courses, Seminars, workshops, etc., may be substituted for operating experience on a case by case basis, and the equivalency will be determined by the Board.

6.02 (e) Where applicable, operating experience may be substituted for educational requirements as specified below:

- [i] Operating experience applied to educational requirement may not also be applied to the operating experience requirement.
- [ii] One (1) year of Direct Responsible Charge operating experience may be substituted for a year-for-year basis for one (1) year of college level education.

6.02 (f) Substitutions for formal education may be made as follows:

- [i] Specialized operator training courses, correspondence courses, seminars, workshops, etc., may be substituted for formal education on a case by case basis; and the equivalency will be determined by the Board.
- [ii] An acceptable High School Equivalency Certificate (GED) may be used to substitute for a High School Diploma.
